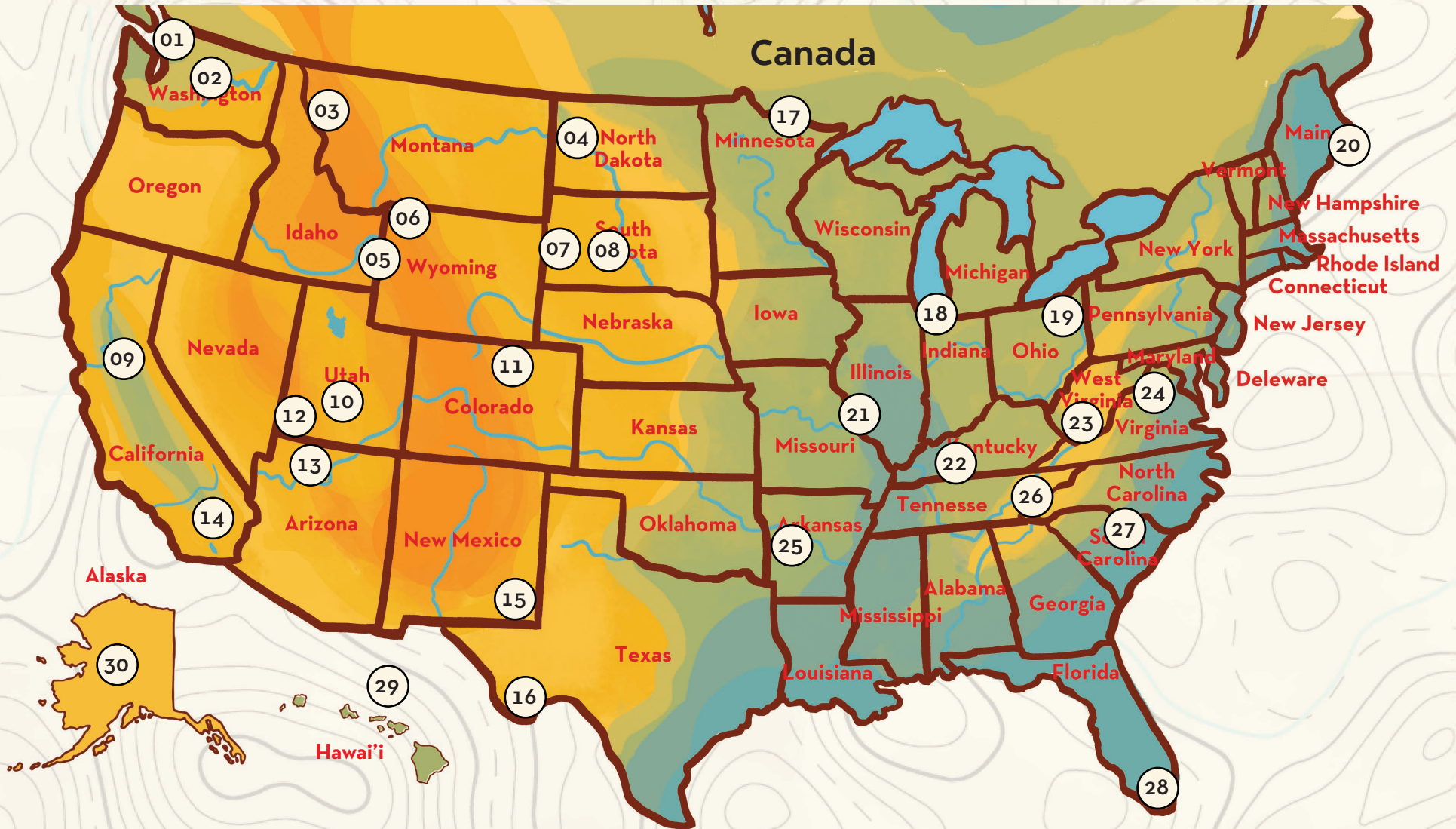


Family Travel Collectible Stamps

They stopped to take pictures of the different sites they passed, played fun car games together, and sang along to their favorite songs.



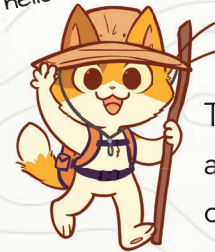
The family made the most of their visit to the Grand Canyon by checking in at the Ranger Station to get maps of the trails and find out what fun things they should do.



They were so amazed by the beauty of the canyon.

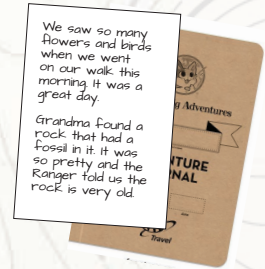

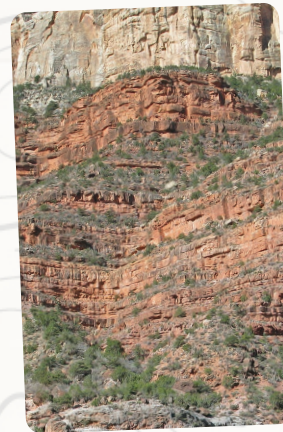


They hiked the trails and admired the vastness of the canyon.

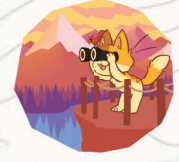

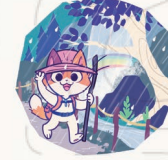
