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AIC honours outstanding partners for uplifting seniors' lives

The Agency for Integrated Care (AIC) presented the Friends of Community Care (FOCC) Awards to 13 recipients today. These recipients were recognised for their strong support and contributions to strengthen the Community Care sector, and for enriching the lives of seniors.

2. Guest-of-Honour Mr Ong Ye Kung, Minister for Health, presented the FOCC Awards at the 10th Community Care Work Plan Seminar organised by AIC. This annual event, attended by more than 350 representatives from the Community Care sector and corporate partners, serves as a platform for Community Care organisations to align on strategic priorities for the sector.

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3. There were four award categories, namely Corporate (Small & Medium Enterprise), Corporate (Large Enterprise), Government and Public Institution, and Non-profit Organisation.

4. An award recipient under the Corporate (Small and Medium Enterprise) category is Simplicity Casket. This company, a subsidiary of Singapore Casket, has partnered with various community and healthcare organisations for over 15 years, providing more than 200 pro bono funeral services and pre-funeral arrangements to individuals in need. Beyond end-of-life services, Simplicity Casket preserves cherished memories for seniors and their loved ones by offering professional photography services and handprint moulds.

5. Simplicity Casket's compassionate end-of-life care services are driven by its belief that everyone deserves a dignified send-off, regardless of their circumstances. "Our vision is rooted in compassion and respect for all individuals," said Mr Jeffrey Lee, Sales and Marketing Manager of Simplicity Casket. "We believe that dignity is a basic human right, and we are committed to preserving it even in life's final moments."

6. One of the recipients in the Corporate (Large Enterprise) category is PSA Corporation Limited, which was nominated for its flagship corporate social responsibility programme, Health@Home. This initiative started in 2015, and more than 800 staff volunteers have organised over 650 activities for beneficiaries from Community Care organisations such as HCA Hospice, Lions Befrienders, St Luke's ElderCare, and Stroke Support Station (S3).

7. Health@Home has also empowered over 25 retired staff to continue giving back. Since 2019, retiree volunteers have been facilitating rehabilitation and therapy programmes for stroke survivors at S3 to regain independence and confidence. Mr Nelson Quek, Regional Chief Executive Officer Southeast Asia, PSA International, said, "At PSA, we believe that meaningful community engagement goes hand in hand with creating value for our people. Our Health@Home programme reflects PSA's commitment to supporting Singapore's healthcare ecosystem and ageing population, while also enhancing the well-being of our diverse workforce. By equipping our staff with healthcare and caregiving knowledge, as well as purpose-driven volunteering opportunities, we foster a culture of inclusivity and personal growth, and create meaningful impact both within and beyond the workplace."

8. Launched in 2020, the FOCC Awards celebrate organisations outside the Community Care sector that have made significant contributions towards enhancing the lives of seniors. *(See Annex for the list of recipients)*
