

Registration Waiver Policy

Version 1: August 1, 2023 – Effective Immediately

The New IDEAS Study has instituted a Registration Waiver Policy to be adhered to by each referring physician and dementia practice that participates in the study.

Effective September 1, 2023, the New IDEAS Study Team will re-open the "All Other Races/Ethnicities" cohort to <u>only</u> those sites who have registered at least ten (10) participants since March 1, 2022 (Note: Registrations must represent 10 unique individuals, not reregistrations).

Sites that meet the registration waiver criterion:

- Will automatically be allowed to register patients in the All Other Races/Ethnicities cohort in the New IDEAS Portal beginning September 1, 2023.
- Should continue to focus on enrollment of other minoritized populations (e.g., Asians, Pacific Islanders, Indigenous populations) into the newly opened cohort (See the <u>Case</u> <u>Report Form Packet</u> pg. 3 for race/ethnicity identifiers).
- Will be limited to 10 new patient registrations per month in the All Other Races/Ethnicities cohort to ensure equal representation and access to care across participating sites in the study.

Sites that do not meet the registration waiver criterion have two options:

- 1) Continue active study participation with authorization to enroll Black/African American and/or Hispanic/Latinx participants until the cohorts are closed. (Note: Sites that meet the above registration waiver criterion after September 1, 2023 will be issued a registration waiver until the All Other Races/Ethnicities cohort is closed.)
- 2) Request site termination. If the site feels that it can no longer contribute to meet study's enrollment goals for the Black/African American and Hispanic/Latinx cohorts, please email newideas@acr.org and submit a termination report to the IRB.

This policy is in concurrence with the clinical study agreement entered between the dementia practice and the American College of Radiology (ACR), where the study reserves the right to cap enrollment for a physician, a dementia practice, or an entire study cohort (i.e. racial and ethnic sub-groups) with immediate effect (See Enrollment Cap Policy).
