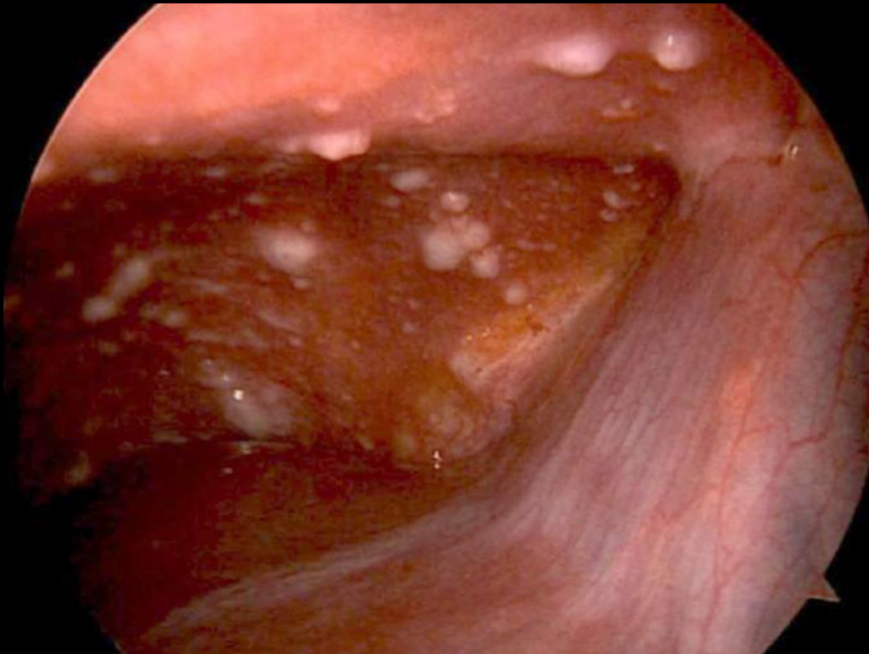
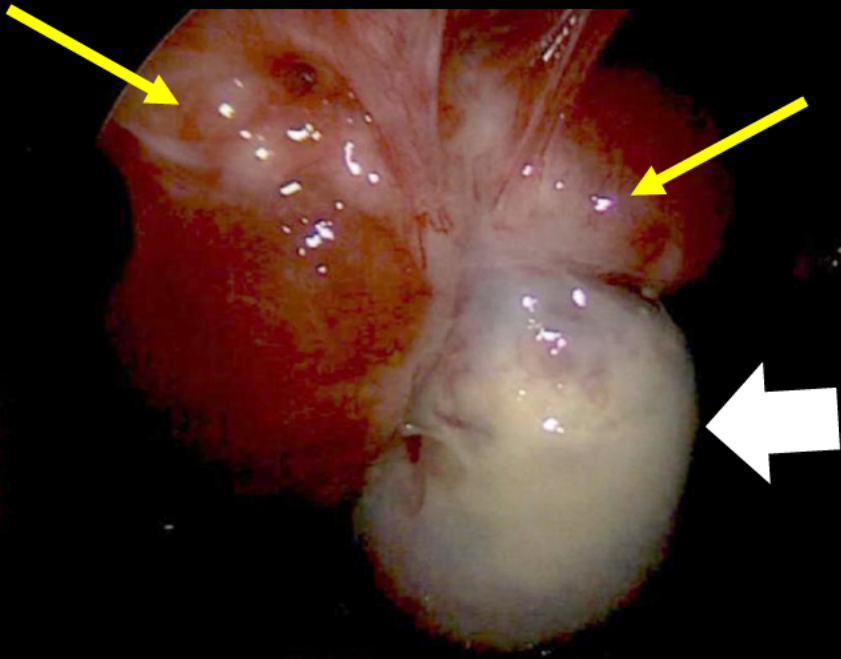
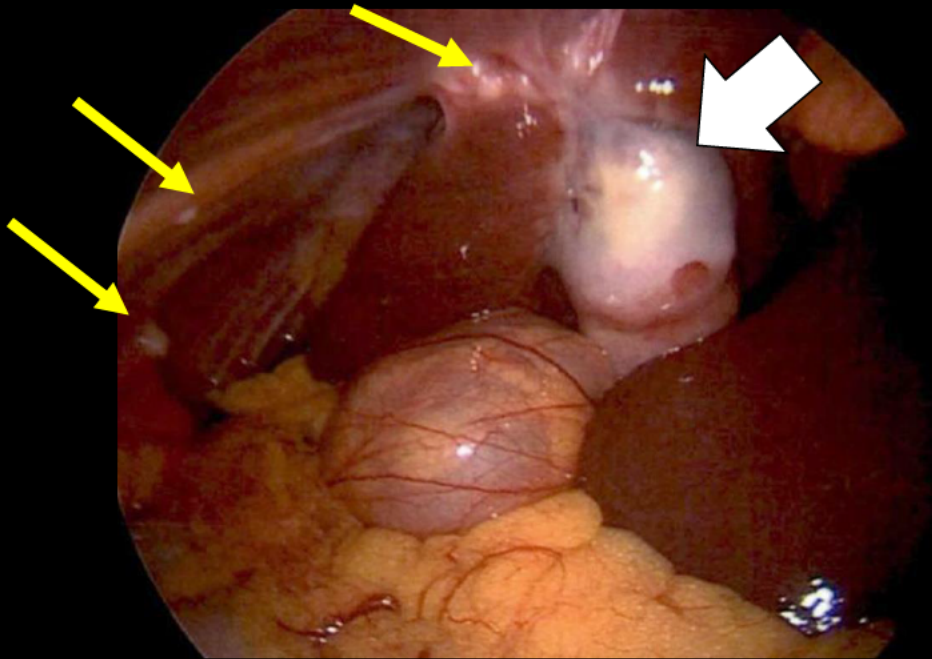


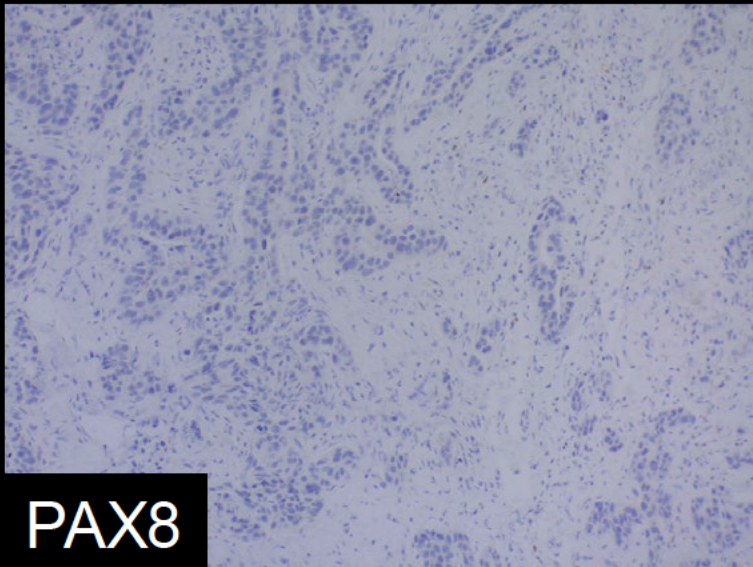
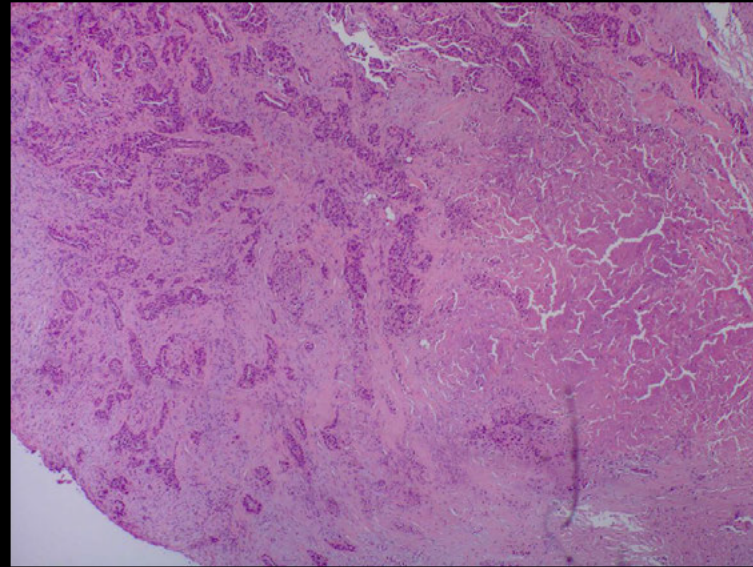
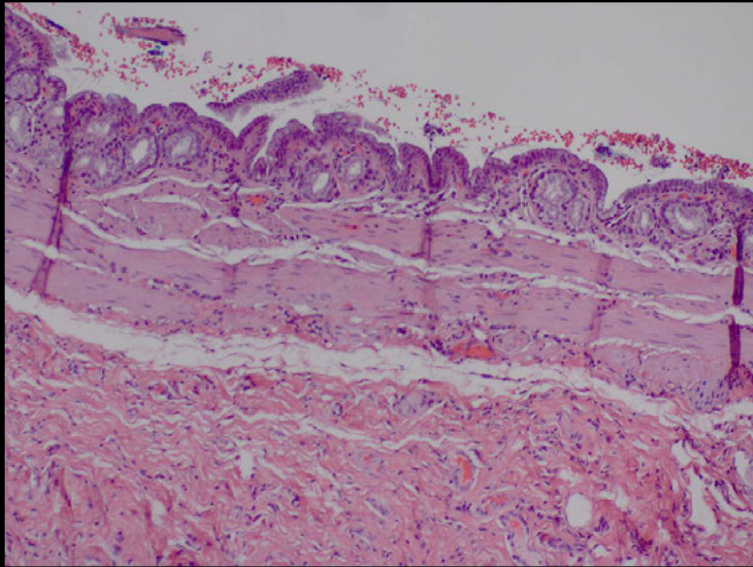
Clinical information
