## Transitions of Care – Medication Reconciliation Post-Discharge (TRC)



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### Did you know?

Capturing TRC-Medication Reconciliation Post-Discharge has become a lot easier, and reportable! By using CPT II codes when billing claims, we can streamline reporting, and potentially avoid the need to share your records for HEDIS Measure improvement. ### What are CPT II Codes?<sup>1</sup>

CPT II codes are supplemental tracking codes that can be used for performance measurement. The use of the tracking codes for performance measurement can decrease the need for record abstraction and chart review, and thereby minimize administrative burdens on physicians and other healthcare professionals. These codes are intended to facilitate data collection about quality of care by coding certain services and/or test results that support performance measures and that have been agreed upon as contributing to good patient care. CPT II codes are billed with a \$0 billable charge amount.

### Transitions of Care (TRC) – Medication Reconciliation Post-Discharge Description<sup>2</sup>

The percentage of discharges for patients 18 years of age and older who had documentation of medication reconciliation on the date of discharge through 30 days after discharge (31 total days).

	Codes	Compliant Result	Definition
<b>Medication Reconciliation Post-Discharge</b>	<b>1111F</b>	✓	Discharge medications reconciled w/ the current medication list in outpatient medical record



Four rates are reported in the Transitions of Care Measure. The Medication Reconciliation sub-measure is the only sub-measure that has qualifying CPT II codes.
