

COMPREHENSIVE DIABETES MANAGEMENT

Ensuring patients receive comprehensive diabetes services including A1c, EED, & KED



HBD (A1C) MEASURE: The percentage of patients 18-75 years of age with diabetes (types 1 and 2) whose last HbA1c test was shown in control.

Common Coding: 83036, 3044F, 3051F

Did you know 2 rates are reported for this measure?

- Medicare Advantage is compliant with an A1c result of $\leq 9\%$
- Federal Employee Plan is compliant with an A1c result of $< 8\%$

Best practice: Aim for $< 8\%$ with all patients, regardless of line of business.



EED MEASURE: The percentage of members 18-75 years of age with diabetes (types 1 and 2) who had a retinal eye exam.

Common Coding: 2022F, 2023F & 3072F

Note an eye exam result documented as “unknown” does not meet criteria.



KED MEASURE: The percentage of members 18-85 years of age with diabetes (type 1 and type 2) who received a kidney health evaluation, defined by an estimated glomerular filtration rate (eGFR) and a urine albumin-creatinine ratio (uACR), during the measurement year.

Blood Test: Estimated glomerular filtration rate (eGFR)

Urine Test: Urine albumin-creatinine ratio (uACR) OR

Combo Test: Complete **BOTH** quantitative urine albumin test **AND** a urine creatinine test within 4 or less days apart.
