Pediatric Anesthesiology Fellowship

Our ACGME-accredited fellowship is structured to meet the requirements for subspecialty certification in pediatric anesthesiology. The core of the training program involves the care of pediatric patients in the operating rooms, other anesthetizing locations and intensive care units, and includes out-of-OR anesthetics, pre-anesthesia evaluation, post-anesthesia care, pain management and advanced life support for neonates, infants and children.

As a fellow, you will:

- Receive clinical training at one of the nation's largest and busiest academic pediatric centers. In all, more than 25,000 anesthetics and sedations are performed annually by our team in 18 operative suites, two hybrid cath labs, three special procedures, five out-of-OR locations and our off-site outpatient Surgicenter.
- Complete rotations focused on out-of-OR sedation, pediatric cardiac anesthesia, pain management, neuroanesthesia, ENT, ambulatory anesthesia and experience in both the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit and Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit.
- Receive a top-tier education during various didactic learning events, such as a weekly lecture series, departmental Grand Rounds, simulations, journal clubs and our weekly divisional quality improvement conference.

Fellows have weekday clinical responsibilities as well as an on-call schedule. Most call is taken from home for index-level cases, with about one overnight, midweek call per month. Weekend call is designed to provide trainees with off-hours supervisory experience.

A few additional opportunities extended to our fellows will include:

- An optional 6 to 12 months of training with additional clinical expertise in cardiac anesthesiology, pain management or critical care
- Participation in global health opportunities with some of our esteemed faculty members
- Elective rotations that could offer more time in CV, pain service, neonatology critical care or any other rotation type approved by our program director
- Training in basic science or clinical research
- Opportunity to submit case studies and research and present at a variety of pediatric national and international conferences, such as SPA, ASA and MARC
