Children's National Hospital is conducting a new study for treatment of peanut allergy. The VITESSE trial seeks to evaluate the safety and effectiveness of an investigational peanut patch treatment designed to potentially reduce the severity of the body's allergic response to peanuts.

Study Overview:

Children between the ages of 4 and 7 who have a physician-diagnosed peanut allergy and are in good physical condition may qualify to participate in the study. If your child participates, they will need to attend a number of in-office doctor visits where different procedures will take place. The total duration of the trial may include three visits within 42 days for the screening process, including two days for food challenges, a treatment period of 12 months with approximately 9 visits, and two exit food challenges. You will be required to document daily dosing in the provided e-diary. The diary will need to be brought to the research site on your child's trial visit days.

Why participate?

Peanut allergies are a common and potentially life-threatening condition, and current treatment options are limited. By participating in this study, parents and children may contribute to the development of a new treatment option for peanut allergy.

What is expected?

Participants in the VITESSE Trial are expected to attend all scheduled visits, provide accurate and honest information to the research physician about their physical state and well-being, use the investigational medication as instructed, and discuss any questions they may have about the trial with the research physician. By participating in this study, parents and children may contribute to the development of a new treatment option for peanut allergy.
