#### Inside the hospital, I go to the welcome desk. My

parents get a sticker. Now, I go to the Cardiology Clinic.






I take the elevator to the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor to the Cardiac Clinic. Cardiac means heart.






My parent checks in at the front desk.

I wait for my name to be called.







I sit and the cuff wraps around my arm. It feels like its hugging me, a tight squeeze. If I am scared I can sit with my parent.



Next, I get my oxygen checked. This clip holds my finger. It does not hurt and I am safe.





The nurse checks my heart beat. They listen with this scope. I take deep breaths.



## I step on the scale to check my weight. I stand still all by myself.






The nurse measures my height. I stand tall and still. If I am nervous, I can hold my parents hand.





# I walk back to the exam room where I'll get a check up. My parents will be me.







I lay down. The nurse takes my blood pressure. She puts a cuff around my arm. It gives me a tight squeeze.



They check my oxygen again. This time they use a sticker, it goes around my finger. I am safe. The sticker stays on.





## This is the EKG machine.





I get lots of stickers on my chest. The stickers stay on. If I'm scared, I can watch a show or hold my parents hand.



The nurse puts tiny clips on each sticker. These clips connect to the machine








I stay still as the EKG is done. It takes about 5 minutes. I am very brave staying still during the EKG.



When the EKG is finished the nurse takes off the clips and stickers.



I did a great job. We wait for the doctor to talk with us.







I am all done! I get a reward like a bravery sticker. My doctor and parents are proud of me! I am proud of myself too.
