

Clubfoot Cast Care Instructions

Keep It DRY

- Casts cannot get wet! Wet casts cause skin irritation, infection, and can damage the cast.
- For bathing:
 - o Never submerge a cast under water
 - o Perform sponge baths only
 - o If cast gets wet, please contact our nurses line for instructions

Skin Care:

- Wash skin not covered by cast with a damp wash cloth.
- You may lotion the skin around the cast. Do not put any type of lotion inside the cast.
- Do not put any type of powder inside the cast.

When to get help:

Please notify our staff if:

- 1. Toes move further inside the cast (Please take a photo of toes after each casting)
- 2. Toes are pale or discolored
- 3. The cast breaks or becomes wet
- 4. Your child is irritable and unable to be consoled
- 5. Unexplained fever

Steps for Soaking off Cast

- 1. Obtain a basin (do not use a sink or bathtub as the plaster will harden in pipes) and mix 4 tablespoons of white vinegar with 1 quart warm water.
- 2. Let the cast soak for 25-30 minutes.
- 3. Once the cast is soft, find an end of the plaster material, and unroll the cast. Then remove the cotton padding.
- 4. Do not pour the water down the sink or bathtub drain.
