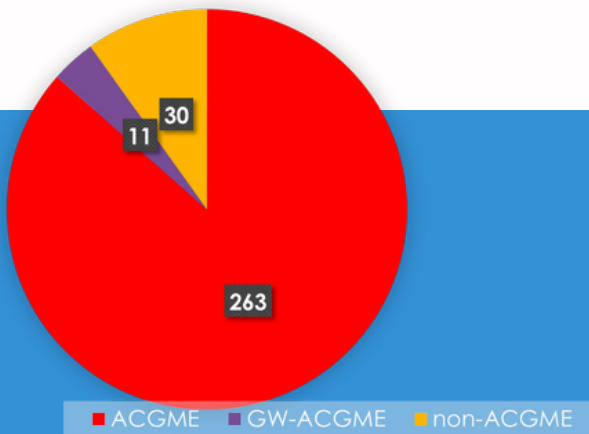

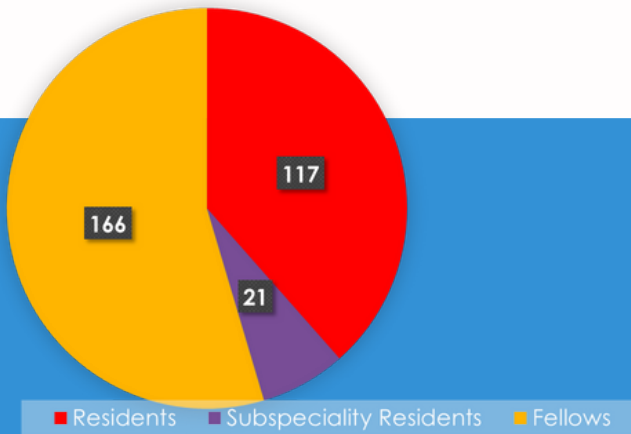
Graduate Medical Education Trainee and Program Data

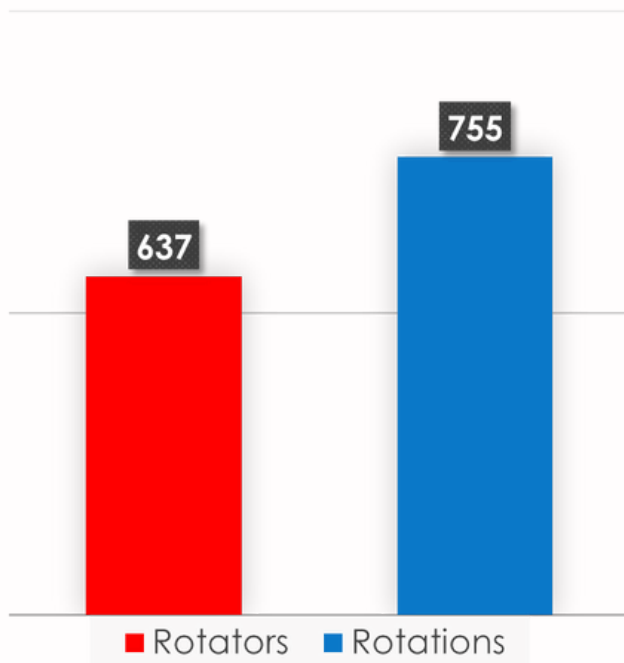

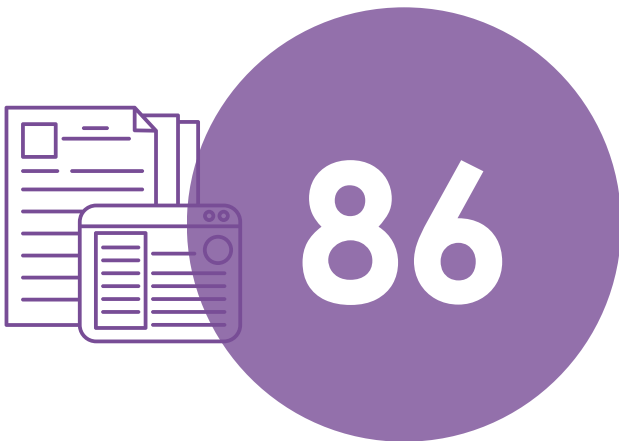


Advancing Diversity in Academic Pediatrics

- Key initiatives for FY24 included forming a DEI-focused residency faculty leadership role and an affinity group to enhance belonging.



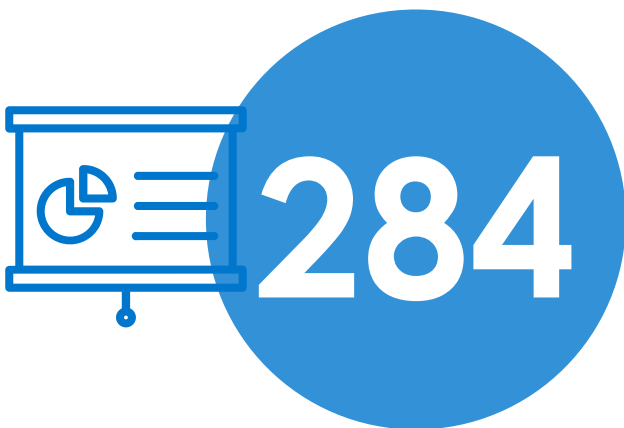

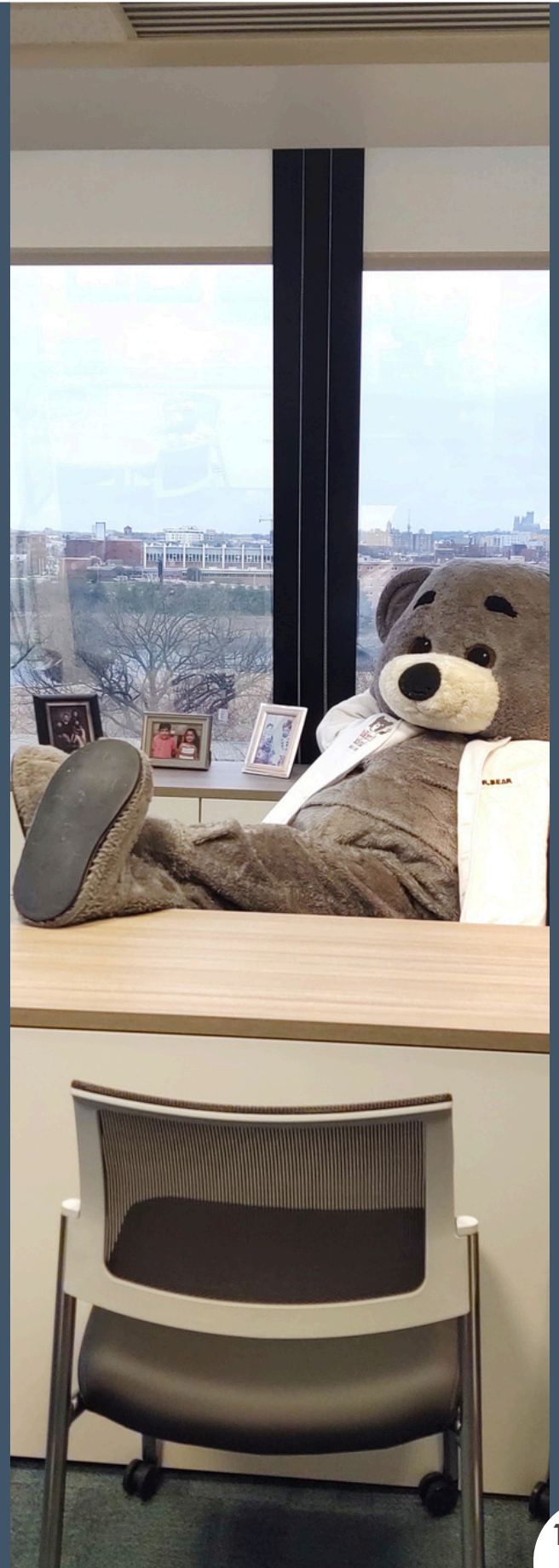

Literature Reviews

Conduct a review of the literature with regard to research topic, in order to gain understanding of current research landscape prior to study design.



Methodology

Support in developing an academically rigorous educational research project through sound study design and baseline/ongoing data collection.



Active Coaching

Regular meetings held with academy members to provide tailored guidance, with support from an expert educational consultant.



Manuscript Writing

Assistance in manuscript preparation tailored to journal, editing, or co-authorship. Aid in selection of appropriate journal for manuscript submission.



Financial Support

Funding applications available for statistical support, transcription, manuscript editing and other services to support scholarly dissemination.



Service to the Institution

Support professional development in education through the Teaching Skills Academy.



Data Management

Database creation, cleaning, and management. Access to data analysis services and aid with IRB applications. Facilitation of coordination with CTSI.

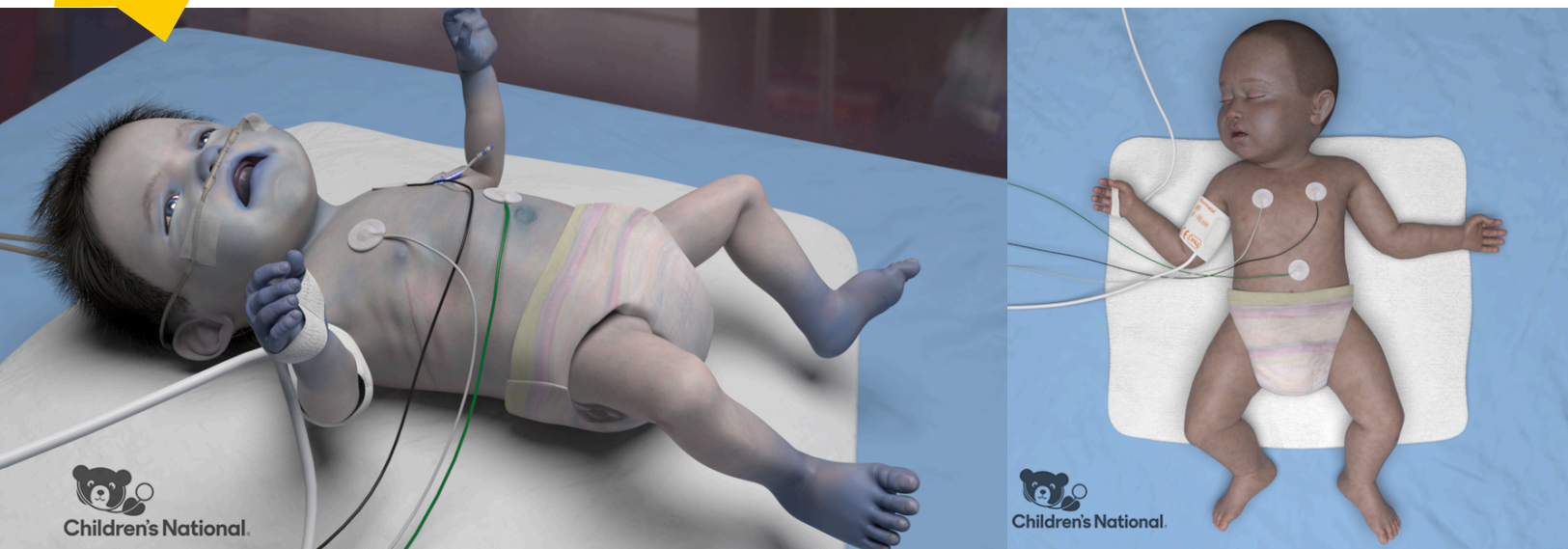
Fellows Appreciation Week: Continue to collaborate with housestaff council and wellness director to create meaningful fellows' appreciation week activities.
