If your child has Turner syndrome and short stature, they may be eligible to participate in a study testing a new medicine called vosoritide to see if it can help your child grow taller.

Vosoritide for Treatment of Short Stature in Turner Syndrome is a clinical research study testing an experimental medicine. Vosoritide was approved by the FDA to help children with Achondroplasia grow taller and is given as a small shot under the skin once a day.

Your child may qualify if:

- Age 3 to <11years old
- Have never received growth hormone OR are not growing well with growth hormone injections
- Willing to comply with study procedures and attend visits at Children's National 4 times over 13 months
- ❖ Will need to discontinue growth hormone injections, if taking, at least 2 weeks before the screening visit and remain off growth hormone for the duration of the study
- ❖ They will receive the study medicine vosoritide for 12 months and have the option to continue receiving the medicine in an extension study if it helps them grow better

There is no cost to you to participate in this research study.
