

Navigating the rise in inspections: The Impact of AMLA on Financial Institutions

Context

Creation of the AMLA: Context

To reinforce its fight against money laundering and terrorist financing, the European Union has introduced a comprehensive Anti-Money Laundering (AML) package. This legislative framework harmonizes AML/CFT rules across member states, facilitates access to financial information and enhances supervision and enforcement.

The package includes three core components:

- A new AML Regulation (AMLR): Establishing uniform rules on customer due diligence, beneficial ownership transparency, and reporting obligations.
- The 6th AML Directive (AMLD VI): Enhancing cooperation between member states, improving the role of Financial Intelligence Units (FIUs), and ensuring better oversight of beneficial ownership registries.
- Transfer of Funds Regulation (TFR).
- Creation of the Anti-Money Laundering Authority (AMLA) by the Regulation (EU) 2024/1620 (AMLAR) to centralize and enhance supervision at the EU level.

Key roles and responsibilities of AMLA

The AMLAR established the AMLA, headquartered in Frankfurt. The AMLA is a decentralised EU agency that will coordinate national authorities to ensure the correct and consistent application of EU rules. The aim of the EU Authority is to transform the anti-money laundering and countering the financing of terrorism (AML/CFT) supervision in the EU and enhance cooperation among FIUs:

AMLA will directly supervise certain **high-risk financial institutions**, coordinate with national supervisors to enforce consistent AML/CFT rules, support FIUs by enhancing cooperation and information sharing, and develop technical standards to harmonize practices, ensuring a unified and efficient approach across the EU.

Rising AML Inspections

We have observed a marked increase in onsite inspections and visits with financial institutions, as well as regulatory enforcement actions across the EU.

This significant increase could be a precursor of the new AMLA intent to maintain close oversight and be promptly alerted to any suspicious or noncompliant practices.

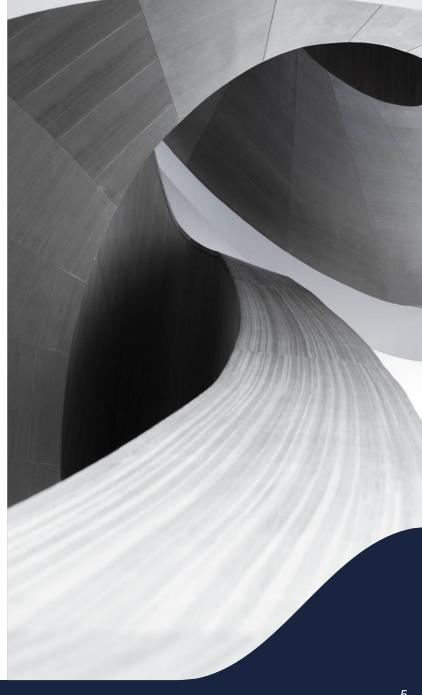
