

THE ANGIOR FAMILY FOUNDATION APPLICATION GUIDELINES

HOW GRANTING DECISIONS ARE MADE

Members of the committee evaluate grant applications according to the intentions of the Foundation's founder, Leonard Holmes Angior, that is:

- The Anglican Church of Australia Trust Corporation for the Diocese of Melbourne,
- Charities having, as their main purpose, the support of performing arts in Australia, and
- Charities engaged in the provision of medical services or in medical research of any description.

Advisory committee members consider annual and multi-year applications for funding up to \$30,000 from February to the middle of March via SmartyGrants.

ELIGIBILITY

The Foundation can only consider requests from organisations that:

- Have an Australian Business Number (ABN)
- Are registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC), and
- Are a Deductible Gift Recipient level 1 (DGR1).

The Foundation will prioritise requests from applicants based in Victoria and/or initiatives that benefit Victorian communities, however national and interstate requests may be considered.

GRANT EXCLUSIONS

The Foundation does not make grants for the following purposes:

- To or on behalf of individuals
- Capital fund-raising for major building purchase, construction, and maintenance works
- General fundraising appeals
- Motor vehicles and buses
- Sport, recreation, or social activities for their own sake
- Scholarships and bursaries
- Arts projects for art's sake – however, the Foundation will consider arts initiatives that support public education or that facilitate the improvement of social outcomes
- Provision of health and medical services already provided by Public Agencies
- Protection and welfare of domestic animals.

APPLICATION TIMELINE

The funding round is based on the calendar year and generally opens in February. Application timeline will be updated every year, please refer to our website [here](#).



GRANTING PROCESS

Step 1: Applicant reviews the granting guidelines and funding criteria to self-assess eligibility.

Step 2: Applicant completes the online application by due date “*Applications Close – Date*”, noting that no more than one application is to be submitted in total by any one organisation.

Step 3: Advisory committee meets to review grant applications in May each year and make recommendations to the trustee.

Step 4: Trustee advises applicants of outcome. Successful applicants receive grants by in the week commencing 1 June each year.

Step 5: Progress report and / or acquittals will be requested by the Trustee approximately 12 – 15 months after grant payment.
