

# CLEARVIEW WEALTHFOUNDATIONS SUPER MEMBER OUTCOMES ASSESSMENT

## INTRODUCTION

In this report, Equity Trustees Superannuation Limited publishes the results of our annual assessment of how well the ClearView WealthFoundations Super product (the **product**) issued from ClearView Retirement Plan (the **fund**) provides member outcomes and promotes members' financial interests. The assessment is based on information as at 30 June 2024.

## METHODOLOGY AND STRUCTURE

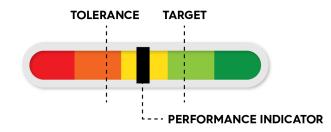
In conducting this assessment, we compared the product to other choice superannuation products included in statistical data published by the Australian Prudential Regulation Authority (**comparable products**) using the criteria in Part 6 of the *Superannuation Industry (Supervision) Act 1993* and Prudential Standard SPS 515 *Strategic Planning and Member Outcomes*.

This report includes:

- our overall assessment of whether the product provides optimal member outcomes and promotes their financial interests;
- a dashboard that depicts our assessment of the product's market-relative performance for each outcome we aim to provide members;
- a table summarising the key metrics that we relied on when making this assessment; and
- our commentary on this performance that includes action items to improve suboptimal performance.

For each member outcome, the dashboard presents the relevant segment of market performance. The width of each segment is based on the range of market performance for each outcome and is specific to each outcome. The positioning of the black performance indicator bar against the colour coding is our assessment of how well the outcome has been delivered. The colour coding gives a visual representation of performance that moves from neutral (yellow) through orange to least tolerance (red), and in the opposite direction from yellow to the target (or green) area of the dashboard. The assessment of each member outcome is based on several equally-weighted metrics. Accordingly, if one metric is outside our tolerance level it doesn't automatically mean the entire member outcome is outside our tolerance level.

The target is generally the average position of the comparable products while the tolerance level is the trigger for us to consider any necessary actions to improve member outcomes.

## **OVERALL ASSESSMENT**

Having carefully considered the comparisons of the product with comparable products set out in this report, including the dashboards, metrics, commentary, and other relevant information available to us at the time of writing, we have concluded that as a result of the following factors the product is promoting members' financial interests:

- 1. the fees and costs that affect the return to members are appropriate having regard to their financial interests;
- 2. the net returns for the product (i.e. returns after deducting all fees, costs and taxes) are consistent with market rates;
- 3. the level of investment risk for the product is acceptable in relation to the net returns generated;
- 4. the investment strategy for the product is appropriate;
- 5. the options, benefits and facilities offered in the product are appropriate for members;
- 6. the insurance premium charged for the product does not inappropriately erode members' account balances;
- 7. the insurance strategy for the product is appropriate; and
- 8. the scale of the product and the fund does not disadvantage members.

## DASHBOARD

### **STRATEGIC CONTEXT**

Working together with the ClearView Group, our purpose is to provide members with appropriate, sustainable retirement outcomes over the long-term to secure their financial future and help them to achieve their desired retirement lifestyle.

To support this purpose, our goals for the fund is to successor fund transfer (**SFT**) out all divisions by 30 June 2025, to maximise the potential for members' financial interests to be promoted over the long term. Prior to completing an SFT, our goal is to provide members with quality services and support at a competitive fee structure.

The product is a choice accumulation product.

### **INVESTMENT RETURN**

1.0 Investment returns and associated targets and tolerance levels are weighted averages for the product. The weighted averages are based on the performance, asset allocation and funds under management of the investment options available in the product. The table in Appendix 1 provides more information. 1.1 - 1.3 The product's fee structure leads to different net returns for different account balances. The table in Appendix 2 provides more information.

1.2 – 1.3 Net returns are based on historic returns and the current fee structure.

#### Commentary

The performance indicator measures the weighted average investment return of all investment options in the product over 1, 3, and 5-year periods and is based on an equal weighting of all the metrics in the above table.



Appendix 1 displays the investment returns for each investment option available in the product and the weighted average investment returns for the product over these periods. All the diversified options listed in Appendix 1 have passed the performance test in APRA's Comprehensive Product Performance Package.

This commentary focuses on the 5-year weighted average return to 30 June 2024. The 5-year period is a balance between short-term and long-term performance. When reading this commentary, it's important to bear in mind that past performance is not a reliable indicator of future performance.

Over the 5-years to 30 June 2024 the product's weighted average investment return was outside our tolerance level. A contributing factor for this was the fund's relatively defensive positioning in a rising market. No action is required as a result of this assessment.

The investment strategy for the Fund is reviewed annually, which includes the risk return profile of the investment options, and we are comfortable it is appropriate for members.

Equity Trustees Superannuation Limited became trustee of the fund effective 14 December 2023.

### **INVESTMENT RISK**

#### Commentary

The performance indicator measures the weighted average number of negative annual returns since the product's inception.

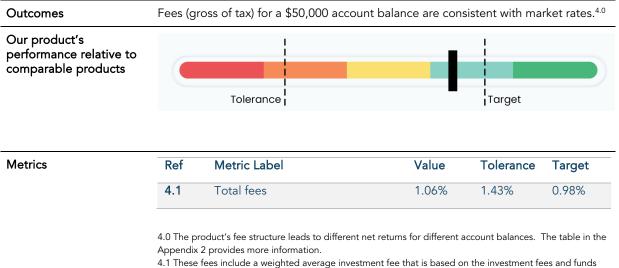
When reading this commentary, it's important to bear in mind that past performance is not a reliable indicator of future performance.

Since inception the weighted average number of negative returns for the product met our target level.

The investment strategy for the Fund is reviewed annually, which includes the risk return profile of the investment options and we are comfortable it is appropriate for members.



## FEES AND COSTS



4.1 These fees include a weighted average investment fee that is based on the investment fees and fun under management of the investment options available in the product.

#### Commentary

This table lists the product's total fees and costs (administration and investment fees and costs). Other fees may be payable which are set out in the product's disclosure documents.

The performance indicator measures total fees and costs together against comparable products.

Total fees were within our tolerance level.

As a result, we are comfortable that fees and costs are consistent with market rates and therefore are appropriate having regard to members financial interests.

### **INSURANCE CLAIM MANAGEMENT**

#### Commentary

The insured benefits in this product are supported by a group insurance policy. There have been no claims in the year ended 30 June 2024.

All insurance cover is voluntary. We believe that the appropriate level of insurance cover is a balance between the amount of cover required (based on the maintenance of the member's, and their dependants', standard of living in the event of an accident or illness) and the affordability of that cover for the member.

Members have the opportunity to seek personal financial advice if required, select their own level of insurance cover and cancel their cover if no longer required. Therefore:

- the insurance premiums charged for the product do not inappropriately erode members' account balances; and
- the insurance strategy for the product is appropriate.

8.4 This is our view of the effectiveness of the Administrator's information and cyber security controls based on an independent review completed during the year.

#### Commentary

The performance indicator measures the delivery of administration services against our service levels, and against the cost of similar services for comparable products.

The performance indicator, which is above our target level, is based on an equal weighting of the above metrics.

As a result, we are comfortable that administration services satisfy member expectations because of the number of administration related complaints, the high rate of service level achievement and the administrator's information and cyber security controls are effective.

Therefore, we consider the options, benefits and facilities offered in the product are appropriate for members

#### Commentary

The performance indicator measures the fund's growth and ability to deliver scale benefits to members against other funds.

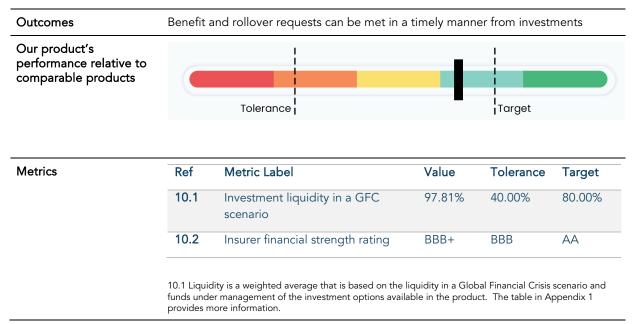
The performance indicator, was outside our tolerance level, is based on an equal weighting of the above metrics.

To gain access to greater economies of scale, among other things, all member accounts in the product were transferred to the HUB24 Super Fund on 1 March 2025.

Therefore, we are comfortable that the scale of the product and the fund does not disadvantage members.



## LIQUIDITY



#### Commentary

The performance indicator measures the fund's ability to meet benefit and rollover requests in a timely manner.

We regularly monitor whether the investments and any insurance policies would be able to meet cash requirements in extreme situations. Based on our analysis, we consider that benefits are supported by liquid investments.

As a result, we are comfortable that the level of liquidity risk for the product is acceptable.
