PRODUCT FOR CONTROL OF PSEUDOCERCOSPORA LEAF SPOT IN CUSTARD
APPLES**

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows the Permit Holder and any person stipulated below to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Products to be used:

CABRIO FUNGICIDE (APVMA No. 55733)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 250 g/L PYRACLOSTROBIN as the only active constituent.

SPRAY DRIFT RESTRAINTS

Specific definitions for terms used in this section can be found at apvma.gov.au/spraydrift.

DO NOT allow bystanders to come into contact with the spray cloud.

DO NOT apply in a manner that may cause an unacceptable impact to native vegetation, agricultural crops, landscaped gardens and aquaculture production, or cause contamination of plant or livestock commodities, outside the application site from spray drift. Wherever possible, correctly use application equipment designed to reduce spray drift and apply when the wind direction is away from these sensitive areas.

DO NOT apply unless the wind speed is between 3 and 20 kilometres per hour at the application site during the time of application.

DO NOT apply if there are hazardous surface temperature inversion conditions present at the application site during the time of application. Surface temperature inversion conditions exist most evenings 1 to 2 hours before sunset and persist until 1 to 2 hours after sunrise.

Buffer Zones

DO NOT apply when there are aquatic and wetland areas including aquacultural ponds or surface streams and rivers within 50 m downwind from the application area.

Directions for Use:

Crop	Disease	Rate
Custard Apple	Pseudocercospora leaf spot (<i>Pseudocercospora anonicola</i>)	80 mL / 100 L plus 10 mL / 100 L of a non-ionic surfactant.

Critical Use Comments:

- Ensure thorough spray coverage of all foliage and fruit.
- **DO NOT** apply more than 3 applications per season, with a minimum retreatment interval of 7 days.
- Applications should be alternated with the use of other registered fungicides, copper and mancozeb.
- Follow the fungicide resistance warning and restraints on the product label.
- Adhere to CropLife resistance management strategy.

Withholding Period:

Harvest: Do not harvest for 3 days after application.

Jurisdiction:

NSW and QLD only.

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

The holder of the permit must notify the APVMA of new information, including relevant information in accordance with section 161 of the Schedule to the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Act 1994*, in accordance with the obligation imposed by that section.

Export of treated produce

Temporary Maximum Residue Limits (TMRLs) have been established to allow treated produce to be used for human consumption. A TMRL has been established for PYRACLOSTROBIN in CUSTARD APPLES. MRLs can be found in the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code (MRL Standard) Instrument 2023*. MRLs apply only to produce marketed and consumed in Australia. If treated produce is to be exported, residues must not exceed the limits/tolerances of the importing country.
