THEN MAKE YOUR RESILIENCE STRATEGY A TEAM SPORT. NOT A DRAIN ON ONE PERSON.

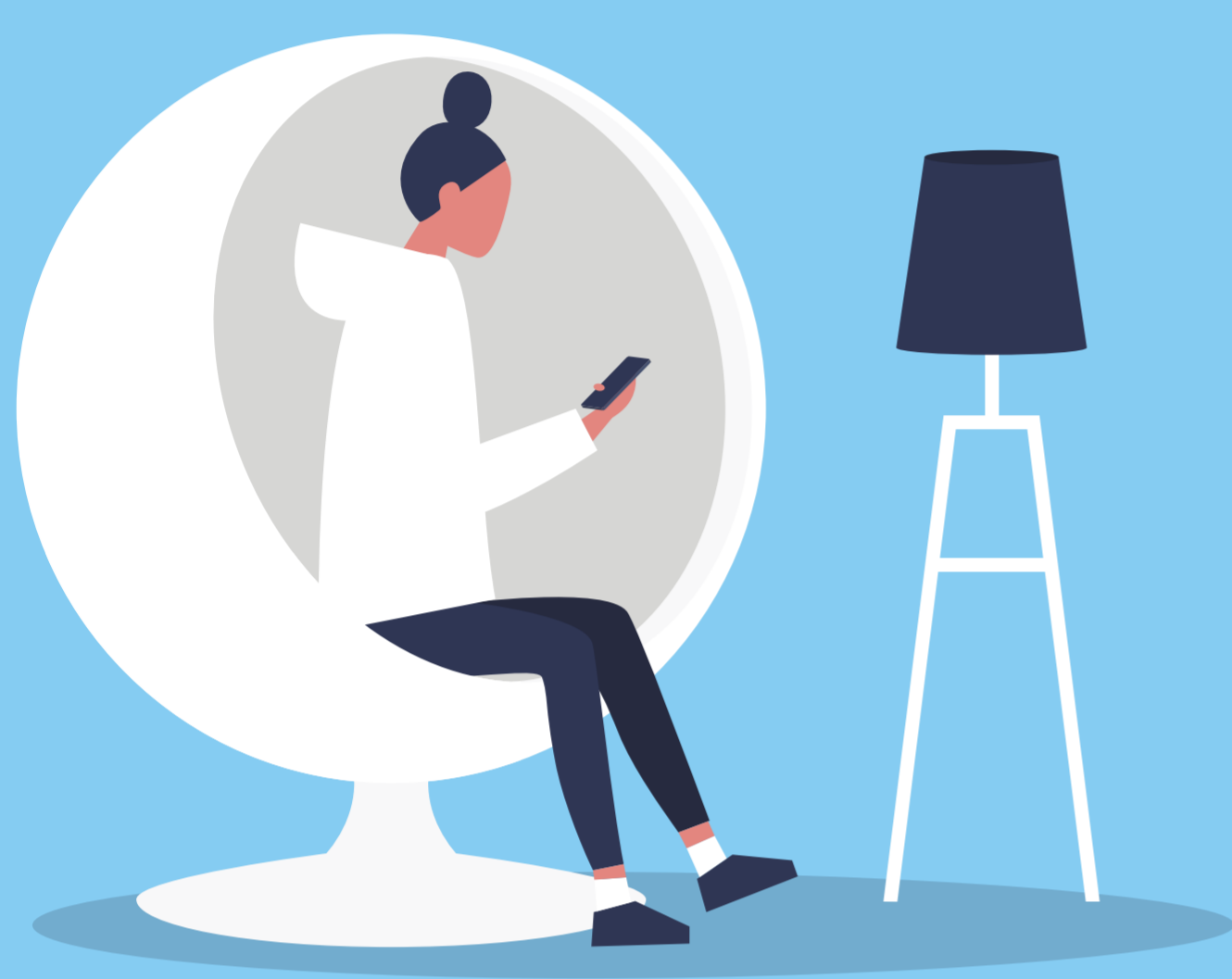
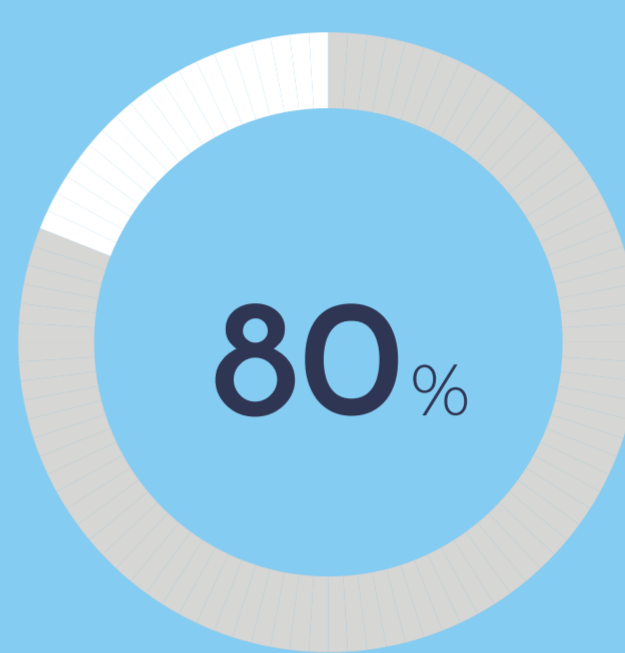

Sure, the promise of flex hours and schedule options is a wonderful thing, except when you start to wrap your head around the impact on your staff, their productivity, and your culture + communications.

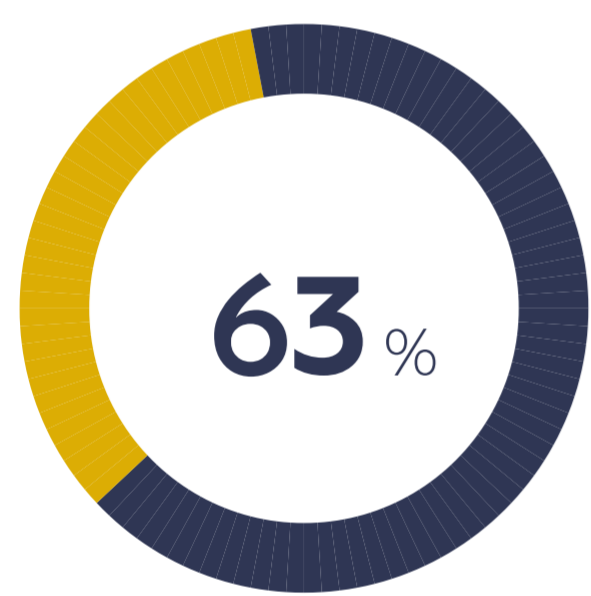


While almost 80% of executives realise that having an agile workforce is a much bigger priority now, they have a lot of work to do in these areas:

PILLAR 2

A disturbing number, especially when you consider that any serious effort to “create efficiencies” must be accompanied by a budget that is blessed by all.

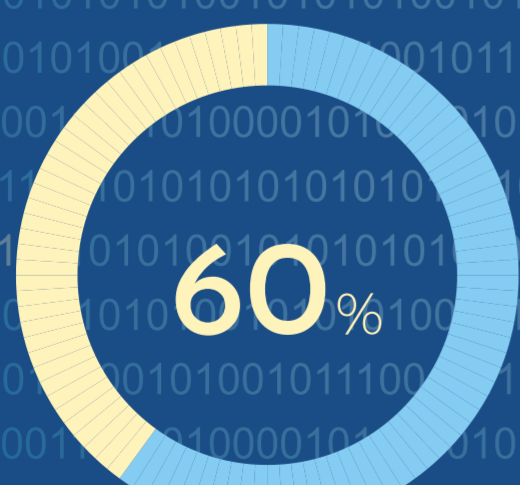
