An Evolving World
Order: Cost of Capital in
the Current Environment

November 2025



Summary

On September 25, 2025, Kroll Managing Director Carla S. Nunes, CFA, and Director James P. Harrington discussed current and projected global economic conditions, global financial market performance, as well as trends in risk-free rates, equity risk premium, cost of debt, and country risk premium assumptions before a live audience of 407 participants.*

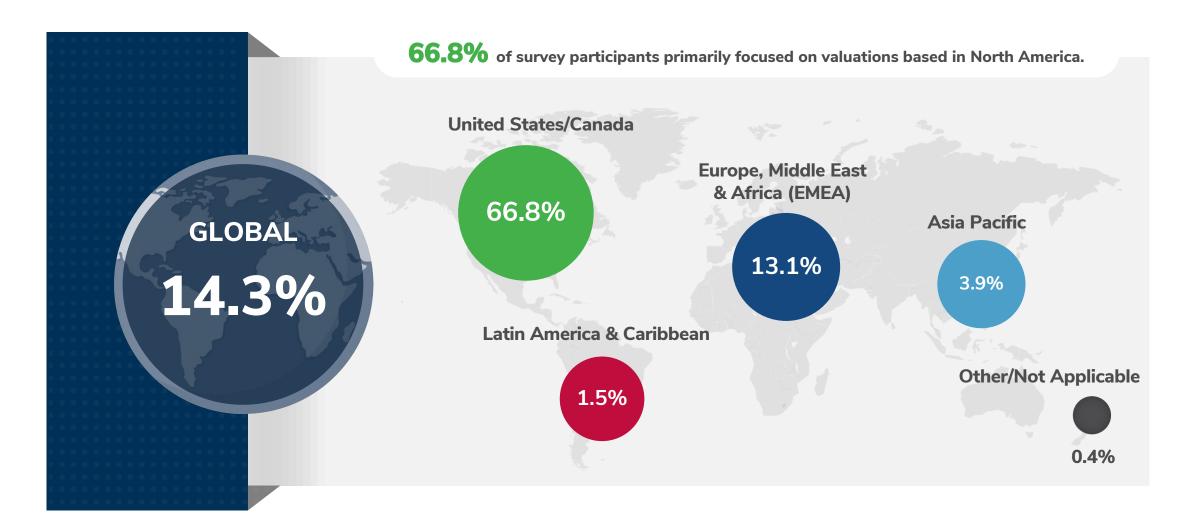
Throughout the webinar, they polled the attendees on their views on the likelihood of an economic recession in 2026 and other valuation and cost of capital related topics.

In the following slides, you will find the results of these polling questions.

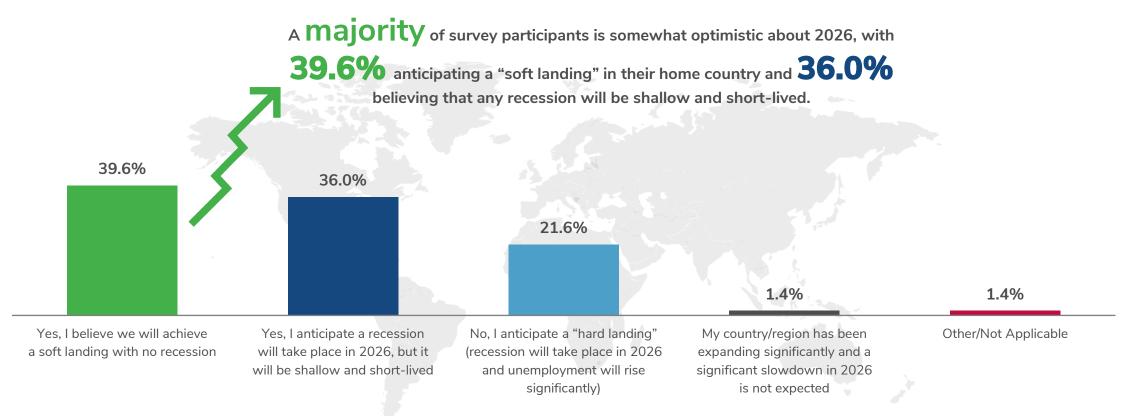
*Out of 407 live attendees, 21% were Kroll employees and 79% were external/third-party participants

In which country/region are your valuations primarily focused?

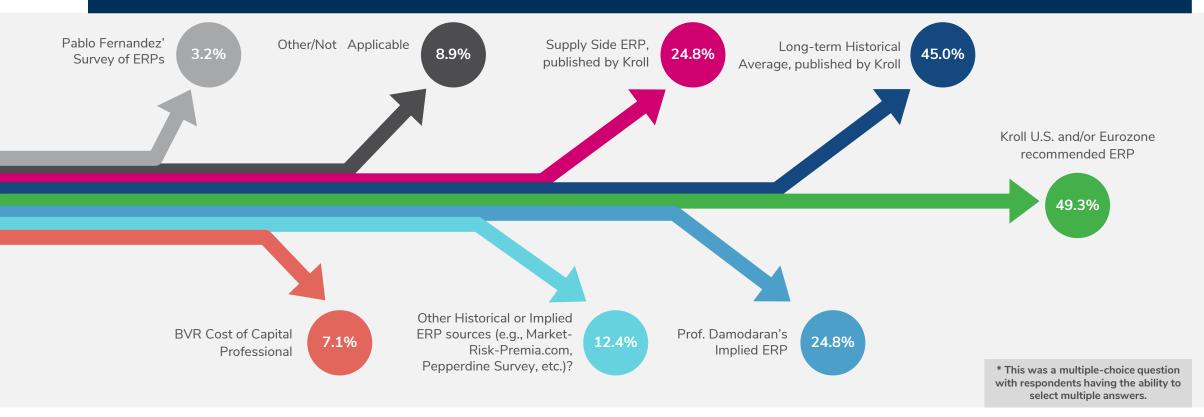


Do you believe the country/region where you are located will achieve a "soft landing" (i.e., inflation comes down without causing a big recession and a spike in unemployment) in 2026?



Which methods/data sources do you use as the equity (market) risk premium (ERP) input in your cost of equity estimates?*

Almost 50% of survey participants rely on the Kroll Recommended U.S. and/or Eurozone ERP, closely followed by the Long-Term Historical Average published by Kroll (45%) as a basis to estimate ERPs. Almost a quarter of the audience utilize the long-term Supply-Side ERP, also published by Kroll, with an equal proportion taking into consideration Professor Aswath Damodaran's Implied ERP.*





Do you believe that the overall cost of capital will return to the low levels observed during the COVID-19 recovery period?

The vast **majority** of survey respondents believes that the overall cost of capital will remain higher when compared to the COVID-19 recovery period.

Only 14.6% believe cost of capital will return to 2020-21 pandemic lows

14.6%

Yes. As major central banks continue cutting policy interest rates, risk-free rates will decline to 2020/2021 levels and equity risk will stabilize.

No. But I believe that risk-free rates will return to 2019 levels (prior to the pandemic), lowering the overall cost of capital.

38.2%

No. I believe that that while long-term risk-free rates will decline, they will stay at similar levels to the 2008-2009 Global Financial Crisis.

5.7%

No. I believe that that upward pressures on long-term risk-free rates and/or increased geopolitical risks will lead to a higher overall cost of capital.
