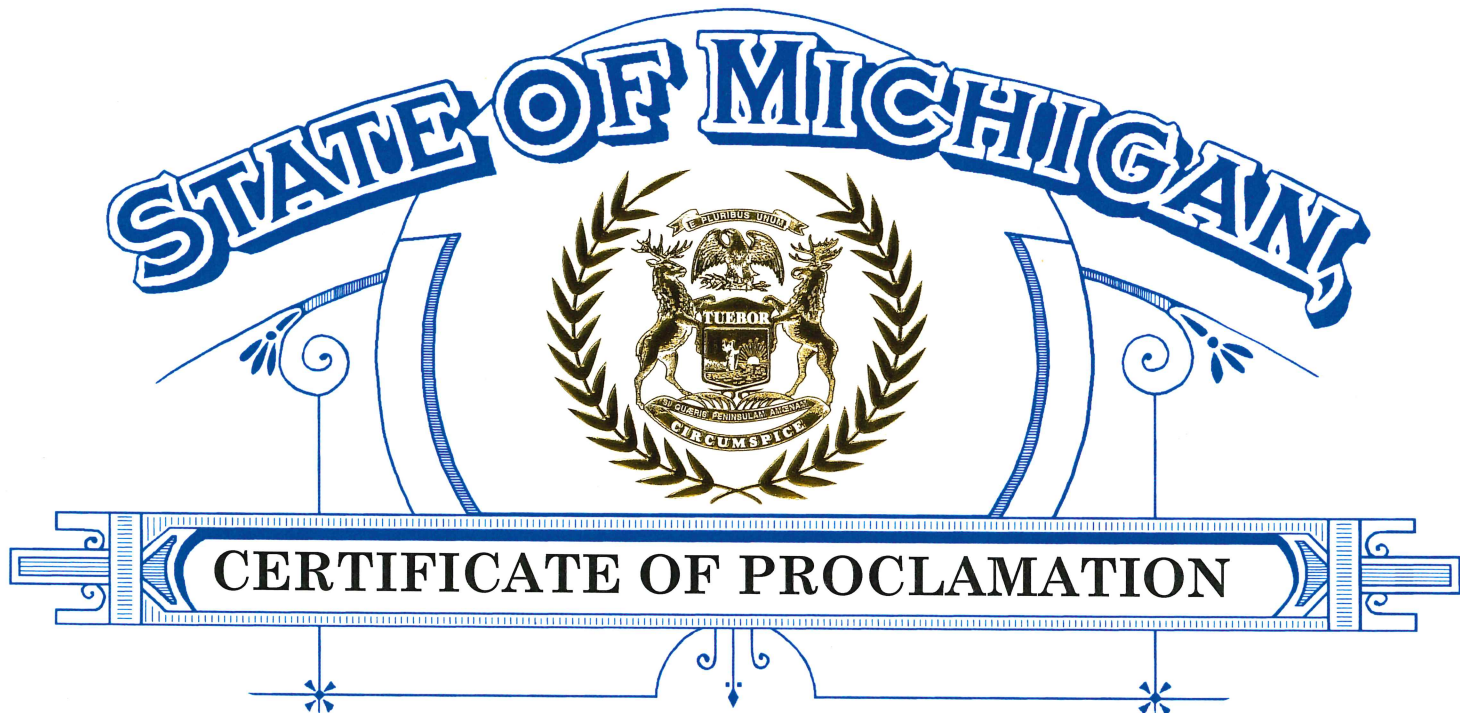




ON BEHALF OF THE PEOPLE OF MICHIGAN,

WHEREAS, rural America is the economic engine that helped the United States become the world leader it is today; and,

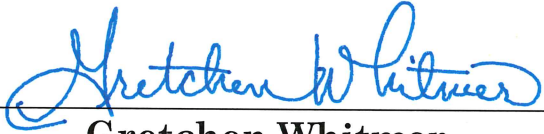
