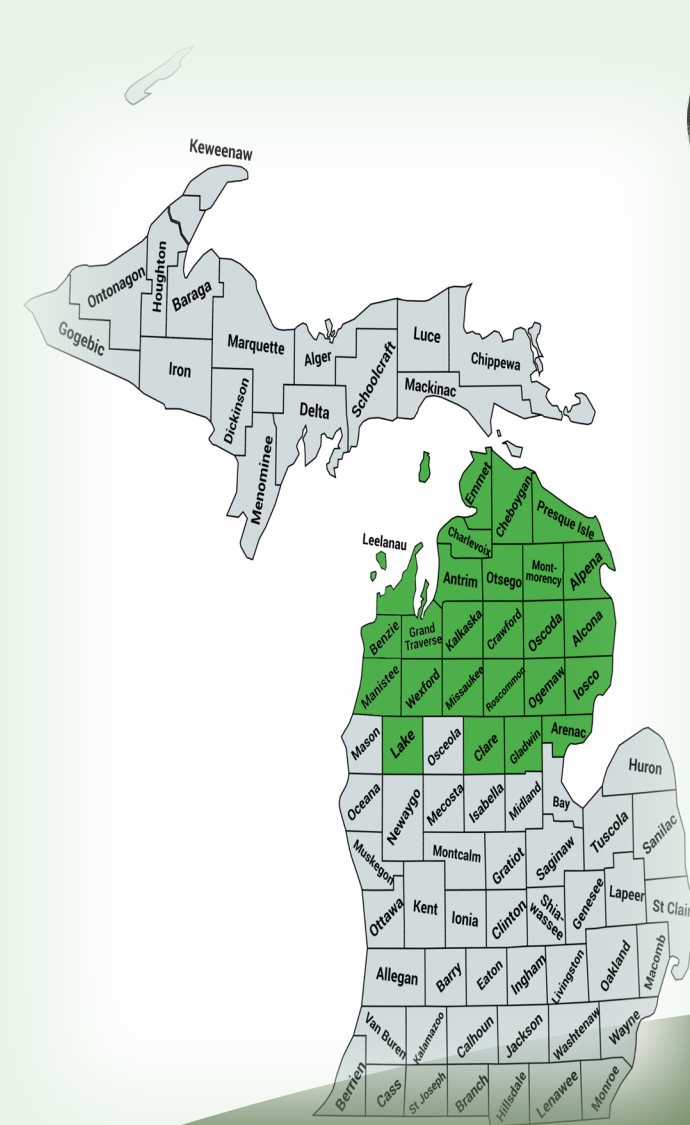

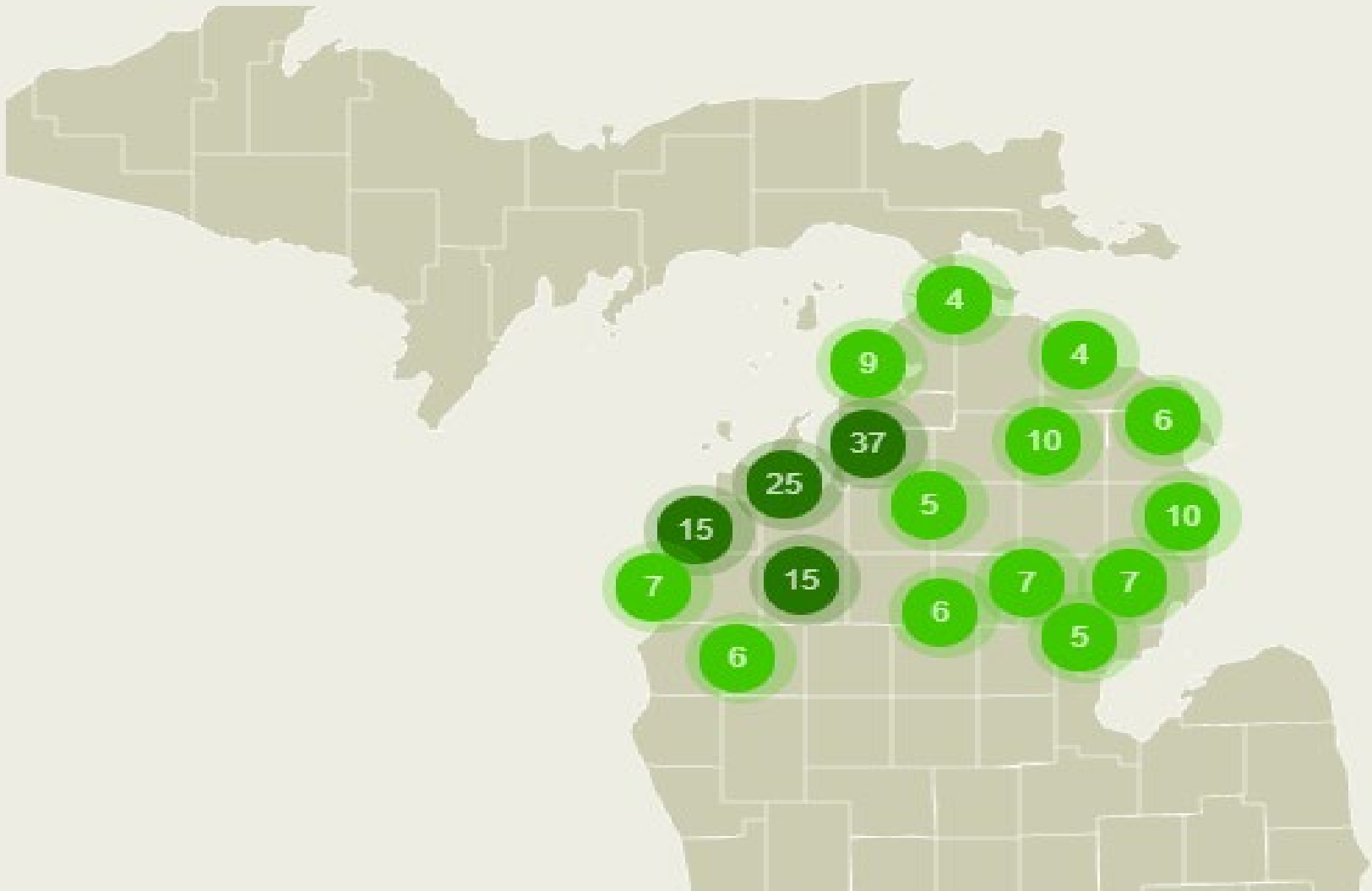
NALOXONE DISTRIBUTION BOXES-

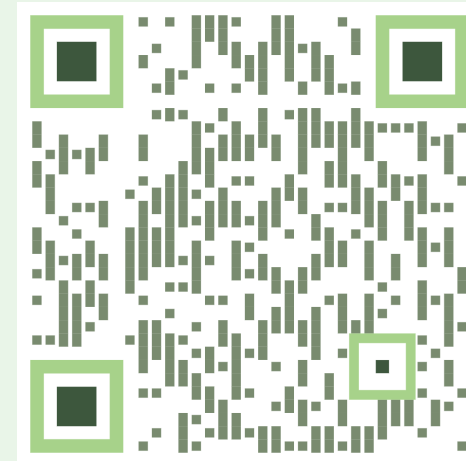
