What We Do – cont'd




Figure 2: QIN-QIO 13th SOW Pillars with CMS Priority Focus Areas: Clinical Aims and Sub-Aims and Foundational Aim and its Sub-Aims; and the targeted providers and outpatient clinical practices.



5 Priority Focus Areas

Prevention & Chronic Disease Management - Vaccinations, Type 2 Diabetes, Hypertension, and Chronic Kidney disease

Patient Safety – Infection Prevention and Control, Adverse Drug Events and Safety Events

Behavioral Health – Depression and Suicide, Substance Use Disorders and Chronic Pain

Care Coordination – Hospital 30 day readmissions; Readmissions to Hospital from SNF, and Community based ED Utilization

Foundational AIM: Quality Management infrastructure: Quality management Systems, Emergency Preparedness, Workforce Planning, Supply Chain, Drug Shortage and Cybersecurity





Data Measures

Outcome Measures:

- CAUTI, CLABI, MRSA, C Diff & SSI (NHSN measures)
- Median Time from ED Arrival to ED Departure for Discharged ED patients (HOQR)
- PSI-90 (composite measures of 10 adverse event indicators)
- Follow-up After ED Visit for Alcohol and other Drug Abuse or Dependence
- Hospital 30-day Readmissions All Cause
- COVID-19 & Flu Vaccination Coverage among Healthcare Personnel
- Safe Use of Opioids Concurrent Prescribing
- Hospital Harm Pressure Injury
