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What is an RHC?

- It is a cost based reimbursed federal program for Medicare and Medicaid patients in a primary care office.
- RHC's have a bundled payment, or All-Inclusive Rate (AIR) per visit, for qualified primary care and preventive health services an RHC practitioner provides.

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RHC Services

- RHC visits must be:
 - Medically necessary
 - Medical or mental health visits, qualified preventive health visits or faceto-face visits between patient and RHC practitioner
 - A qualified RHC service needing an RHC practitioner

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RHC Services

- Types of services:
 - Family practice
 - Internal medicine
 - Pediatrics
 - OB-GYN
 - Some care management services
 - Some virtual communication services

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RHC Practitioners

- Physician
- Nurse Practitioner (NP)
- Physician Assistant (PA)
- Certified Nurse-Midwife (CNM)
- Clinical Psychologist (CP)
- Clinical Social Worker (CSW)
- Marriage and Family Therapist (MFT)
- Mental Health Counselors (MHC)
 - Addiction, drug, or alcohol counselors who meet requirements of MHCs to enroll with Medicare

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Location of Visits

- RHC
- Patient's home
- Medicare-covered Part A skilled nursing facility
- Scene of an accident
- Hospice

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Two Types of RHCs

- Provider based
 - Owned and operated by a hospital, skilled nursing home or home health agency
- Free standing (independent)
 - Standalone clinics owned by a physician, NP, PA, or CNM, but may be owned by hospitals

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Basic Requirements

- Be located in a non-urbanized area
- Be located in a current (4 years) medically underserved area (MUA) or a health professional shortage area (HPSA)
- Provide outpatient primary care services
- Use the services of an advanced practice provider at least 50% of clinic hours

- 42 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 491.9
 - Provision of services
 - Primarily engaged in outpatient health services
 - Patient care policies
 - Direct services
 - General
 - Laboratory
 - Emergency services
 - Services provided through agreements or arrangements
 - Inpatient hospital care
 - Other physician services (ie. skilled nursing facility)
 - Additional diagnostic/laboratory services not available at the clinic
 - Evidence that patients are accepted OR written agreement



- 491.9 Laboratory. These requirements apply to RHCs but not to FQHCs. The RHC provides laboratory services in accordance with part 493 of this chapter, which implements the provisions of section 353 of the Public Health Service Act. The RHC provides basic laboratory services essential to the immediate diagnosis and treatment of the patient, including:
 - Chemical examinations of urine by stick or tablet method or both (including urine ketones);
 - Hemoglobin or hematocrit;
 - Blood glucose;
 - Examination of stool specimens for occult blood;
 - Pregnancy tests; and
 - Primary culturing for transmittal to a certified laboratory.




491.9 Emergency. The clinic or center provides medical emergency procedures
as a first response to common life-threatening injuries and acute illness and
has available the drugs and biologicals commonly used in life saving
procedures, such as analgesics, anesthetics (local), antibiotics, anticonvulsants,
antidotes and emetics, serums and toxoids.



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


- 491.9 RHC Policies
 - The clinic's or center's health care services are furnished in accordance with appropriate written policies which are consistent with applicable State law.
 - The policies are developed with the advice of a group of professional personnel that includes one or more physicians and one or more physician assistants or nurse practitioners. At least one member is not a member of the clinic or center staff.
 - The policies include:
 - A description of the services the clinic or center furnishes directly and those furnished through agreement or arrangement.
 - Guidelines for the medical management of health problems which include the conditions requiring medical consultation and/or patient referral, the maintenance of health care records, and procedures for the periodic review and evaluation of the services furnished by the clinic or center.
 - Rules for the storage, handling, and administration of drugs and biologicals.
 - These policies are reviewed at least biennially by the group of professional personnel required under paragraph (b)(2) of this section and reviewed as necessary by the RHC or FQHC.




