### 5. Curriculum Requests:

#### New

- a. Cropping Systems Science, BS (Karen Renner/Dorcia Chaison)
  - a. We saw a need to add some majors to have some visibility
  - b. We reached into a few other programs to round out the majors
  - c. This is after a 2-year activity to elevate concentrations
  - d. Losing advanced Studies concentration that was not very popular
  - e. No additional resources will be needed- existing resources will be reallocated
  - f. Approved with majority vote and no objections
- b. Environmental Soil and Water Science, BS (Karen Renner/Dorcia Chaison)
  - a. Approved with majority vote and no objections
- c. Turfgrass Science and Management, BS (Karen Renner/Dorcia Chaison)
  - a. Approved with majority vote and no objections
- d. Plant Pathology, MNUN (Dorcia Chaison)
  - a. 4<sup>th</sup> group of research sciences and there seemed to be interest in a minor
  - b. There was a gap when we compared ourselves to other institutions
  - c. Do not require any additional resources/courses
  - d. Allows for specialty career advancement
  - e. Approved with majority vote and no objections
- e. Philosophy and Law, BA (Sonja Fritzsche or a PHL designee)
  - a. Our graduate program has been know for this, but our undergraduate program has simply retained the traditional major
  - b. Previous concentration was tremendously popular and now would

like to move to make it a major

- c. No additional resources are required to offer this degree
- d. Will work closely with pre-law and humanities
  - i. Both gave a survey a couple of years ago of graduates of this program and this served as a catalyst to create this program
- e. No additional classes outside of Philosophy will be needed for this degree
- f. Approved with majority vote and no objections
- f. Philosophy and the Sciences, BA (Sonja Fritzsche or a PHL designee)
  - a. Would benefit graduates with this concentration
  - b. No new resources will be needed for this or the minor
  - c. Concern for overlap with existing Science in Society programs in Lyman Briggs
  - d. Additional courses outside of Philosophy in sciences will need to signed off on by those colleges offering them since they are 300 & 400 courses and additional courses on top of the requirements for the degree just to get into these courses
    - There are students who already have these majors are taking Philosophy courses and are interested in additional degrees in philosophy
    - ii. Need to make more transparent in degree requirements to ensure that students do not start a program that they can't complete due to inability to get into required courses
  - e. We will table this degree vote until Philosophy is able to answer some of these questions about how to enable students to complete

- h. Public Affairs for Secondary Education, BA (Jeff Judge)
  - a. A way that the student can still have the JMC experience and still have the degree for education
    - i. They would be certified to teach Social Studies
    - ii. This pulls different courses that are JMC specific and allows JMC to continue to support students pursuing education for those who also want to have residential college experience
    - iii. There are about 40 students per year doing this
  - b. Approved with majority vote with no objections

#### Moratorium

- i. LB Computer Science, BS, Field of Concentration (Niki Rudolph)
  - a. Currently have coordinated computer science offering along with Engineering and this is a moratorium that exists just in Lyman Briggs
  - b. Been working with students who currently in this BS program to graduate in Spring
  - c. Finding alternate paths for students interested in this major
  - d. Approved with majority vote with no objections
- j. Environmental and Sustainability Studies, MNUN (Lynmarie Posey)
  - a. RISE was moved to the office of Undergraduate Education-resulted in uncoupling of minor and residential
  - b. Consulted with Ag & Natural Resources
  - c. New students will not be allowed to sign up for this minor, but current students pursuing this minor will be able to continue as a minor
    - i. It is one year to evaluate and up to 2-year moratorium
  - d. Concerns that there was no discussion about moratorium and there

are students who have completed the courses but cannot declare their minor

- e. Would impact our rating for Sustainability and we are one of 10 universities that have achieved this rating
- f. Also impacts ranking for Times ranking for Sustainability
- g. Tied to MSU 2030 Strategic Plan
- h. Students from 11 different colleges are enrolled in this minor
- Request made to table for now so that Lynmarie can take it back to colleagues
  - Motion to table denied with majority vote, with one vote to approve tabling
- j. Moratorium denied by majority vote with no votes to approve
- k. Environmental Geosciences, BS (Lynmarie Posey)
  - a. 49 students last year
  - b. Being replaced by new BS in Earth & Environmental Sciences launching Fall 2026
  - c. Approved with majority with no objections
- l. Geological Sciences, BS (Lynmarie Posey)
  - a. 40 students last year
  - b. Being replaced by new BS in Earth & Environmental Sciences launching Fall 2026
  - c. Approved with majority with no objections

Discontinue – all are needing to be discontinued due to changes in requirements from state of Michigan

- m. Economics, Disciplinary Teaching Minor (Ken Horne)
  - a. Approved with majority vote with no objections
- n. Geography, Disciplinary Teaching Minor (Ken Horne)
