## RANGER ONE


Ranger One recently completed a 24-hour FTX. They are now focusing on recruitment and training R1 MS3s who are preparing to attend camp.

## CLUB SPOTLIGHT: *Pathfinders*

Last semester, Pathfinders remained heavily involved in the Battalion by hosting optional land navigation training, supporting MS3 CST preparation through additional STX lane repetitions, assisting with AFT preparation, and strengthening alumni connections, many of which are still ongoing. This semester, Pathfinders are shifting their primary focus to a 10-week recruitment period while continuing to work closely with MS3s to ensure camp readiness. Current actives report that MS3s are in a strong position, confident and well prepared for CST, with only final details remaining.

Ranger 1 successfully completed a demanding 24-hour field training exercise featuring high-intensity close quarters battle (CQB), force-on-force engagements, and the Star Course land navigation. The exercise pushed cadets to their limits, testing physical endurance, tactical proficiency, and mental resilience in a realistic and fast-paced training environment. Building on this success, Ranger 1 is now aggressively focused on recruiting highly motivated cadets and sharpening the readiness of MS3s as they prepare for the challenges of camp.




# FALL COMMISSIONING



Former CDT Amelie Lepley has committed to her Active Duty contract and will commission into the Air Defense Artillery (ADA) branch. Following her commissioning ceremony, she was immediately slotted for BOLC-B at Fort Sill and is currently there completing that training. After BOLC, Lepley will remain at Fort Sill for an additional year. During this period, she will fill a 13A slot, working as a platoon leader for Basic Combat Training (BCT). Lepley will then be assigned to Germany for a three-year assignment, where she will work on high- to medium-altitude air defense systems (HIMAD).

Lepley recommends that lower MS levels get comfortable being uncomfortable: "You are in the critical years of learning—take advantage of being able to fail and learn with the amazing support you have." She also encourages you to take lots of pictures and take care of your battle buddies.
