Professor of Military Science Notes

Once again it is my honor to serve as the Professor of Military Science (PMS) for the absolute best ROTC Program in Cadet Command. As we get into the swing of the academic year, I want to reflect on the accomplishments of this program beginning with Cadet Summer Training (CST).

65 Cadets attended training this summer. 29 Cadets graduated Advance Camp. 12 Cadets graduated Basic Camp. 16 Cadets attended a Cultural Understanding and Leadership Program (CULP) in a foreign country like Sri Lanka, Poland, Latvia, Peru, Morocco and Mozambique, among others. 10 Cadets graduated from an Army skill school: Air Assault School (AAS), Combat Diver Qualification Course (CDQC), Basic Military Mountaineering Course (BMMC), Jungle Operators Course (JOC) and Survival, Evasion, Resistance and Escape (SERE) School. And 15 Cadets completed Cadet Troop Leader Training, where they shadowed Army Officers at different posts and locations.

This year's Senior class produced 2 top 10% Cadets and 9 Distinguished Military Graduates. Of our 25 graduating Seniors, nearly half are in the top 20% of all 3,500+ Cadets seeking a commission this year. And they have started this year out as a strong team. They have laid the groundwork for our underclassmen to continue the success of the Spartan Battalion.

The battalion continues to engage in our community and region. I look forward to Alex's Great State Race, the Leadership Ethics and Diversity in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (LEADS) in Detroit and the Veterans Day Ceremony at The MSU Alumni Chapel. The Spartan Battalion also prepares to defend the title in the Brigade Bold Warrior Challenge, and participate in The German Armed Forces Proficiency Badge, and Norwegian Ruck March.

It is a great day to be in the US Army. But spending time with these future Army Leaders is my absolute privilege!
