First Line Supervision Training

The School of Criminal Justice is now accepting online registrations for the Fall 2026 MSU First Line Supervision Leadership Training.

- Learning is driven by reality based work problems
- Participants work in collaborative learning groups
- High facilitator to student ratio 1:6
- Blended interactive learning

This 80-hour course will begin Monday, September 28, 2026 with 3 days instruction in a retreat setting. Learners are required to stay on location. This is followed by 3 days of facilitated distance learning on October 5 - 7, 2026, and 4 days of classroom instruction on October 13 - 16, 2026 at the Eaton County Sheriff's Office in Charlotte, MI.

September 28 - September 30, 2026	Retreat
October 5 - 7, 2026	Distance Learning
October 13 - 16, 2026	Classroom Learning

Tuition cost is \$1375. Includes meals and lodging for 3 days of retreat as well as break refreshments for 4 classroom days at the Eaton County Sheriff's Office, all handouts and access to D2L—MSU's online learning management system.
