## **National AHEC Program**

**Purpose:** Created by Congress in 1971 to recruit, train and retain a health professions workforce committed to underserved populations

**Mission:** Enhance access to quality healthcare, particularly primary and preventive care, by improving the supply and distribution of healthcare professionals via strategic partnerships with academic programs, communities, and professional organizations.

Forty-five (45) states have federally recognized AHEC programs.

Eighty (80) percent of those AHEC programs receive support from their states.





## Michigan AHEC Program

A **statewide network** with five regional centers located in Detroit, Mt. Pleasant, Marquette, Houghton Lake and over 12 committed AHEC staff members and over 50 community individuals serving as regional advisory board members within the five regional centers across the state.



# Mid Central Health Careers Pipeline Program

#### Mission:

The Health Careers Pipeline Program (HCPP) will empower high school students to pursue careers in the health professions.

Through exposure to health career options, mentorship, and health and wellness education, students will participate in engaging, hands-on, enriching experiences that will foster personal growth and leadership characteristics.

The HCPP will be the channel to help students develop their confidence and a support system for their journey into post-secondary education and beyond.





## **Pipeline Programming & Structure**

9 Week Program that meets Monday nights (In-person or Virtual)

#### Participants:

- 1. Living in an underserved (rural or urban) area of the Mid Central AHEC catchment area
- 2. Students in ninth and tenth grade
- 3. First-generation college student
- 4. Displayed interest in a health professions career

Mentors: High School Students are paired with Undergraduate Student Mentors

Program is facilitated by AHEC and 4-12 CMU College of Medicine Students
