Overview: The supplier is required to make certain that all wood packaging material (WPM) has been properly treated and marked prior to shipping. This will ensure your shipment is in compliance with US Department of Agriculture, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) regulations and will prevent your shipments from being delayed or destroyed at the border.

Failure to follow the correct procedures for Importing and Exporting Requirements for Wood Packaging Material could result in tremendous penalties and delay your shipment to the U.S.

Instances where MSU receives a USDA emergency action notification informing us that a shipment was found to contain pests, mold or other compromised conditions, the supplier's order will be re-exported or destroyed within 48 hours. The supplier will be responsible for applicable fees (re-export/re-import).
