CORE TEAM UPDATE

We continue to take small, yet incremental, steps to bring activity suggestions to fruition. We held brainstorming sessions for each of our priority areas during the month. Summaries of those meetings identifying major challenges, current initiatives, identified needs and opportunities for VHWC contribution are being disseminated via email and posted on the website. Recordings of the sessions will be available online. Our next steps will be to draft workplans for these activities to identify collaborators and action steps. We anticipate holding project touch-base meetings every 4-6 weeks. Our team is limited so we plan to prioritize opportunities that address multiple focus areas for greater impact and efficiency. We encourage and welcome self-nominations from individuals who might be interested in serving as chairs or co-chairs of these efforts. ORGANIZATION SPOTLIGHT:

We are proud to feature The War Memorial, a nonprofit cultural and civic center dedicated to honoring those who served, enriching our community, and delivering exceptional experiences through diverse programming.



Located in Grosse Pointe Farms, The War Memorial is housed in the historic Russell A. Alger Jr. House, an Italian Renaissance Revival mansion built in 1910. The organization is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and hosts commemorative events such as Memorial Day and Veterans Day ceremonies and supports veteran-focused initiatives like our bi-monthly Vet-To-Vet gatherings and VetConnect Seminar Series.

The War Memorial, which partners with veteran organizations like the Grosse Pointe Veterans Club and American Legion Post 372, offers concerts, art exhibitions, lectures, and workshops, including performances by the Grosse Pointe Symphony Orchestra and various art classes. In 2024, the venue welcomed over 80,000 visitors, including over 750 veterans who were directly honored and celebrated through specialized programming and events, transforming The War Memorial into a thriving hub on connections, culture, and celebration for all ages. The War Memorial is honored to give back to those who have served our country. Memorial Week returns to the nonprofit organization from May 21 to May 26 with renewed vigor and significance. The week includes our annual fundraising gala An Evening of Red, White & Blue, Our Community Salutes which recognizes and celebrates the Class of 2025 high school seniors from the Detroit area who have made the honorable decision to enlist in the United States Armed Forces, and Memorial Day when the community solemnly gathers for a poignant moment of remembrance for the courageous souls who made the ultimate sacrifice in defense of our cherished freedoms. Also happening this year is The War Memorial's commemoration of the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War's end. The yearlong program series aims to educate the regional community on the Vietnam War and its legacy with a series of diverse events.
