Welcome our new student, embarking on an exciting academic journey with us. Your presence enriches our community, and we look forward to supporting your growth and achievements throughout your studies.





WELCOME OLLIE CYMAN

Ollie (they/them) is the Academic Program Coordinator for both the Office of Rehabilitation and Disability Studies and the Measurement and Quantitative Methods Program in the College of Education. They graduated with a Bachelor's degree

in Sociology from Central Michigan University in Fall 2021. With a primary interest in equitable and accessible education, their academic research focused on factors of academic program



outcomes in higher education and college student success. Ollie started at MSU as an Administrative Business Analyst in early 2022 and has been with ORDS since August 2023.

Newly Accredited CACREP PhD Program in Counselor Education & Supervision

Our doctoral in Rehabilitation Counselor Education has a new designation. The long-standing 74-credit program is now a 66-credit PhD program in Counselor Education & Supervision, which is officially launched in Fall 2024. Students interested in having a specialization in Rehabilitation and Disability can take an additional 9 credits of coursework. This 9-credit specialization track is being processed and approved by the university so that we can continue our tradition in educating, advocating, and conducting research in disability to promote inclusivity, equity, and quality of life. This new designation not only allows us to recruit talented students from other counseling fields, but also gives us an opportunity to educate others about rehabilitation and disability. The 66-credit doctoral program can be completed in as little as three years full-time while the specialization is optional. The program recently received the approval for the CACREP accreditation.

Research & Project Highlight

FITI RESEARCH PROGRAM

After multiple cycles of our LIFE research lab's Family and Individual Transition Intervention (FITI; Drs. Gloria Lee, Sarah Curtiss, Jina Chun, Hung Jen Kuo) implemented on caregivers of autistic transitionage youth (TAY), feedback from



caregivers and practitioners led to an improved version. We added new content to the family psychoeducation group. Dr. Chun develops parallel psychoeducation modules for a youth group. Dr. Lee develops dyadic consultation and coaching sessions, allowing each caregiver-youth pair to collaborate on their transition goals outside the group sessions. This version, FITI+, aims to empower TAY by increasing their transition knowledge, strengthening the caregiver-youth partnership, and improving both caregivers and TAY outcomes.

SIERA PROGRAM

A joined research (Dr. Gloria Lee) and community (Barbara Van Horssen, the Momentum Center at Grand Haven) grant funded by the Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan Foundation for a stress management program for individuals with mental illness at the Center. Based on Dr. Heekyung Lee's emotion regulation intervention for autistic adults, we first ran focus groups with practitioners and individuals in recovery to solicit feedback for modifications of program materials. Drs. G. Lee, H. Lee and Lee Za Ong provided training for the Center staff to deliver the program. We are currently testing the program's feasibility and efficacy. We would like to thank Anne and Sarah in their dedication for running the group, and Asmau for helping with the project.

VIRTUAL REALITY RESEARCH

Recognizing the significance of fostering inclusive workplaces for diverse staff, employers are actively seeking innovative solutions to address the distinct hurdles faced by individuals with disabilities. Among these innovations is the incorporation of virtual reality (VR) meditation practices. VR meditation emerges as a promising avenue for promoting the well-being of individuals with disabilities within work settings, offering an immersive approach to stress management, concentration enhancement, and relaxation

facilitation. Dr. Hung Jen Kuo and Michael Laird (MA student) led a pilot investigation involved 23 participants with various disabilities who participated in daily 5-minute sessions of VR-guided meditation. Findings



demonstrated the feasibility and efficacy of the intervention. Participants reported favorable outcomes, such as heightened job satisfaction, increased work engagement, enhanced quality of life, and greater mindfulness. Notably, statistically significant enhancements were observed in facets of work engagement, particularly in terms of vigor and dedication. Furthermore, participants provided insights for refining future implementations of VR meditation. For more information, please visit https://rehabpower.org.



CELEBRATING A MILESTONE: STRIDE'S FIRST ANNIVERSARY!

Co-directed by Drs. Connie Sung and Marisa Fisher, MSU's Center for Services, Training, and Research for Independence and Desired Employment (STRIDE; https://stride.msu.edu) celebrated a transformative year dedicated to inclusivity in October 2023. At the forefront of bridging research and real-world impact, STRIDE expanded its team, welcoming four full-time members and 15 dedicated students, including two doctoral scholars from Project FUTURE (Focus on the Underserved in Transition Using Rehabilitation and Education), specializing in Rehabilitation Counselor Education and Special Education.



Our collaboration has been far-reaching and impactful, such as the "Ability, Opportunity, and the Future of Work Conference" and "Ethics of Accommodations." Moreover, our network has forged grown exponentially. We've partnerships with 14 local and state entities, ranging from vocational rehabilitation agencies to school districts alongside and beyond, departments and units. These collaborations are a testament to our collective commitment to making a tangible difference in the lives of those we serve.

Here's to a year of groundbreaking achievements at STRIDE, and to many more as we continue to champion the cause of independence and desired employment for individuals with disabilities. Together, we are setting new standards for excellence, inclusion, and empowerment.

CURRENT DOCTORAL STUDENTS RESEARCH PROJECTS

Our doctoral candidate, Heerak Choi is currently working on her dissertation, "The Impact of Self-Stigma and Self-Determination on Career Outcomes of Transition-Age Individuals with Disabilities: A Structural Equation Modeling Approach". It aims to understand the psychosocial mechanisms of transition-age individuals with disabilities and suggest a theory-driven and empirically validated model. Based on the study results, she aims to develop a self-determination-based intervention for the population, experiment with it in the community, and validate its effectiveness.

Our doctoral candidate, Anni Wang, focuses on positive psychology interventions and their potential benefits for transition-aged individuals. Currently immersed in her dissertation project, Anni is investigating the effectiveness of a modified intervention on the well-being of college students. Her ultimate goal is to provide valuable insights to college service providers, offering potential solutions to enhance the well-being of students with and without disabilities. Anni's research underscores her commitment to contributing practical strategies to a diverse student population.

Our doctoral candidate, Michael Yeomans research focuses on promoting the well-being and recreation of individuals with disabilities with counseling and technology. He is passionate about how video game can be leveraged to develop interventions that benefit students with disabilities. Michael has conducted research on the risks and benefits of video games. His recent work has centered on positive cooperative contact via video games and their impact on both implicit and explicit biases. He hopes to continue to explore this unique intersection of rehabilitation counseling and technology with his dissertation and ongoing research.

DR. CONNIE SUNG NAMED APA FELLOW



Dr. Connie Sung was named a Fellow of the American Psychological Association. The designation recognizes Dr. Sung for her contributions to the field of psychology. She is one of five scholars to be named a Fellow of APA's Division 22: Rehabilitation Psychology in 2023. Congratulations to Dr. Sung on this remarkable achievement and her ongoing commitment to excellence in the field.
