MSU TRAVEL POLICY- OBJECT CODES BY LISA REICHSTETTER AND JULIE ROBINSON

Recent updates to MSU Travel Policy limit expense coding to three categories. This policy applies to Report Headers in Concur Travel and eDoc Accounting Lines in KFS. There are several "old" object codes currently active in KFS; those codes should not be used and are only for historical reporting by the university.

The eDoc initiator and the Fiscal Officer should ensure the object code for any travel-related expenses or transactions in Concur Travel and KFS use codes 6901, 6902, or 6903.

- In State (CONUS) = The Object code in KFS 6901
- Out of State (CONUS/OCUNUS) = The Object Code in KFS 6902
- International = The Object Code in KFS 6903

Due to the unique services provided by MSU, the only exception is 6609, Travel- Motor Pool.

ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE (AI) RESOURCES AVAILABLE AT MSU

<u>MSU IT</u> is expanding our campus experience with AI tools by providing a broad range of AI-driven solutions. The goal is to promote success and foster a culture of excellence in education, research, and outreach. MSUIT encourages the use of innovative technology but also understands the risks associated with AI. MSU IT and MSU Ethics Institute have come together to establish guidance on generative AI, and MSU has <u>policies</u> in place for the <u>use</u> of AI.

AI Assistants:

- <u>Copilot</u>: Al assists with coding, writing, creating images, answering questions and is available to faculty, staff and students at no additional cost. The data entered will be secure and will not be used to train the Al model.
- <u>Microsoft 365 Copilot</u>: Integrates Copilot into Microsoft 365 apps (Word, Excel, etc.). Assists with writing documents, data analysis and presentation creation. This will be available in March for <u>purchase</u>.
- <u>Gemini</u>: versatile AI assistant integrated with Google services aimed at brainstorming ideas, speech synthesis, text generation, and image creation. This tool will be available soon.
- <u>ChatGPT</u>: Conversational OpenAI that customizes, improves conversations and has interactive dialogue. ChatGPT will be available at MSU soon.
