SSC Undergraduate College/University Requirements

ISS 2**	Fulfills first of two social science requirements for all majors; not recommended for honors college students
ISS 3**	Fulfills second to two social science requirements for all majors; not recommended for honors students nor first-year students without previous college credit
IAH 20*	Fulfills first of two arts and humanities requirements for all majors; honors college and ASP students should enroll in the honors section
ISB 20*	Fulfills general biology requirement for some majors; not recommended for honors college students or students who take biology, ecology, or plant biology as part of their major (those pursuing a BS degree)
ISP 203A	Fulfills general physical science requirement for some majors; not recommended for honors college students or students who take chemistry, geology, or physics for their major (those pursuing a BS degree)
MTH	Students should enroll in the appropriate math class as determined by their placement score or by AP tests. Students earning a BA can usually satisfy the math requirement by completing MTH 101 and 102. Students earning a BS will usually need to complete a higher level of math. See majors below for suggested BS math class.
UGS 201	Can fulfill serve as either an ISS or IAH requirement for eligible Academic Scholars; must apply to the program: https://honorscollege.msu.edu/programs/asp-ace-program.html
WRA 101	Fulfills first-year writing requirement; honors students should not take the course
