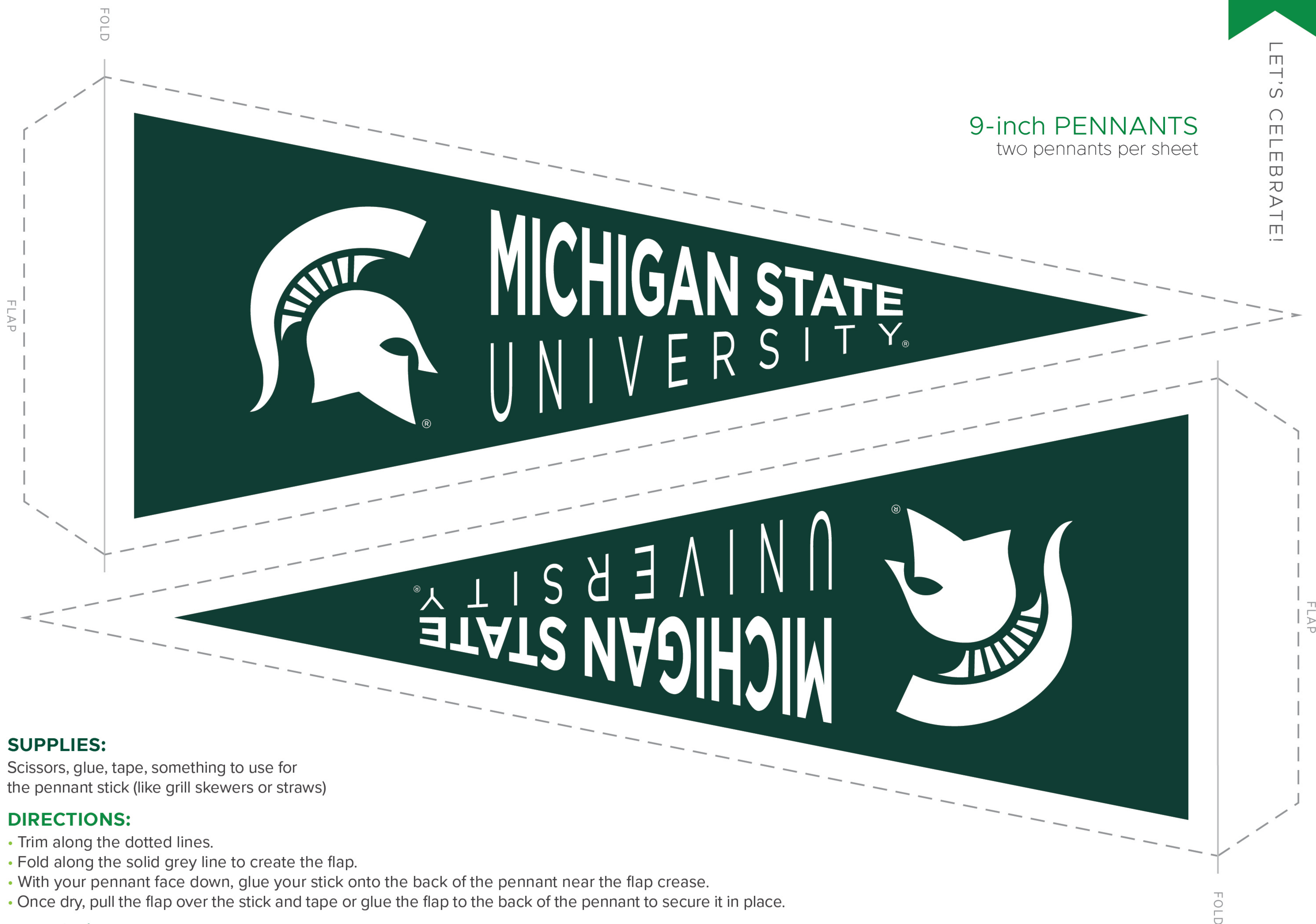




LET'S CELEBRATE!

two pennants per sheet



SUPPLIES:

Scissors, glue, tape, something to use for the pennant stick (like grill skewers or straws)

DIRECTIONS:

- Trim along the dotted lines.
- Fold along the solid grey line to create the flap.
- With your pennant face down, glue your stick onto the back of the pennant near the flap crease.
- Once dry, pull the flap over the stick and tape or glue the flap to the back of the pennant to secure it in place.

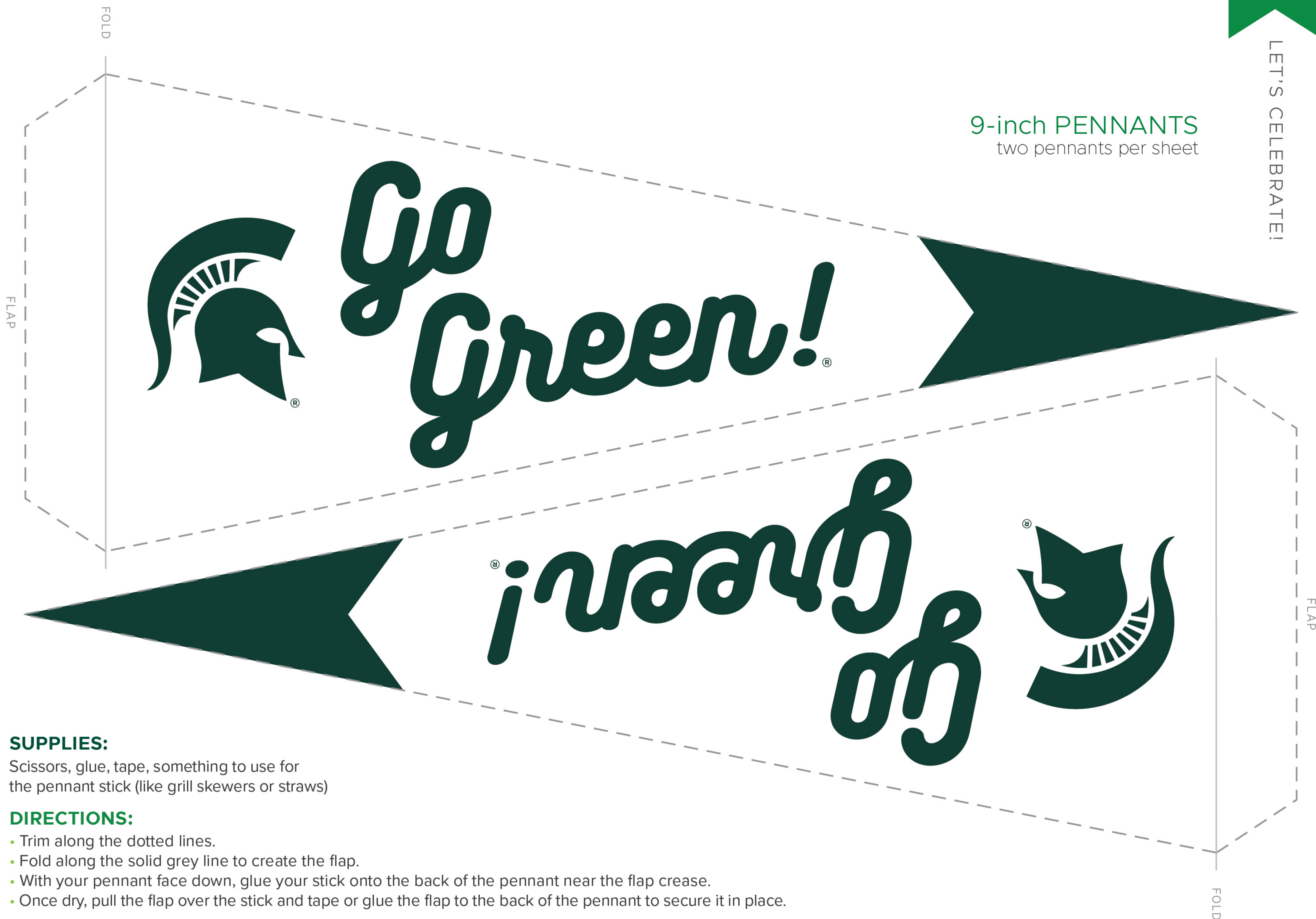
