housing at MSU



To apply for housing, applicants must be admitted into an MSU graduate program and have activated their NetID.

Stay connected to MSU's campus resources and enjoy affordable and comfortable housing while completing your graduate degree in the College of Law.

Graduate students may be placed with undergraduates in suite-style single rooms with a bathroom shared by either law students or other undergrad/graduate students.

There is a \$50 application fee (one-time and non-refundable fee subject to change each year) to apply for housing for students who have not lived on campus before. It can be paid online at the time of application. All on-campus housing can be billed directly to student accounts. Units in 1855 Place and University Village can be broken into monthly or semesterly bills.

Owen Hall

Nearby the College of Law, Owen Hall is known by Spartans as the ideal spot for students who desire a living environment conducive to studying.

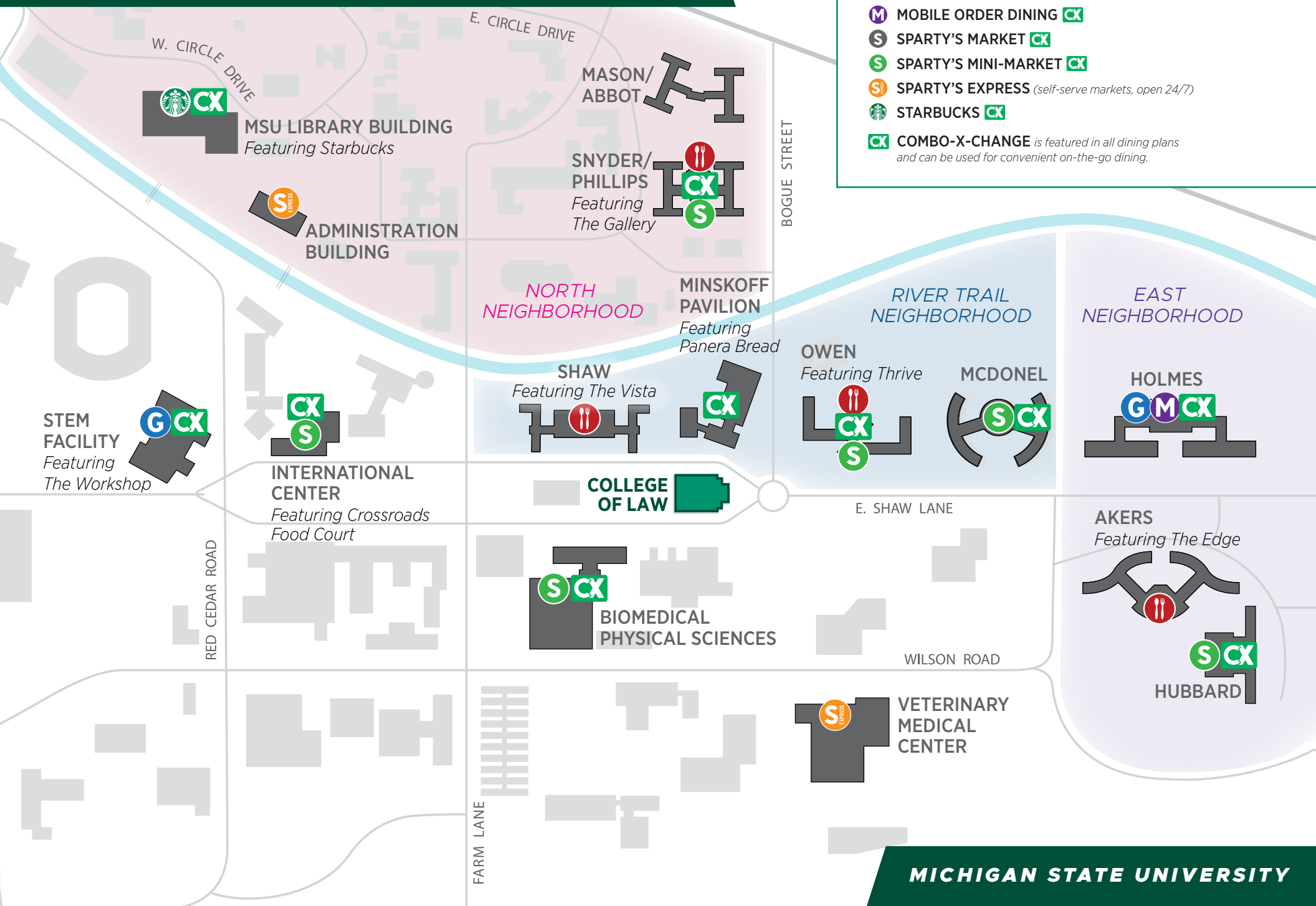
Term Options

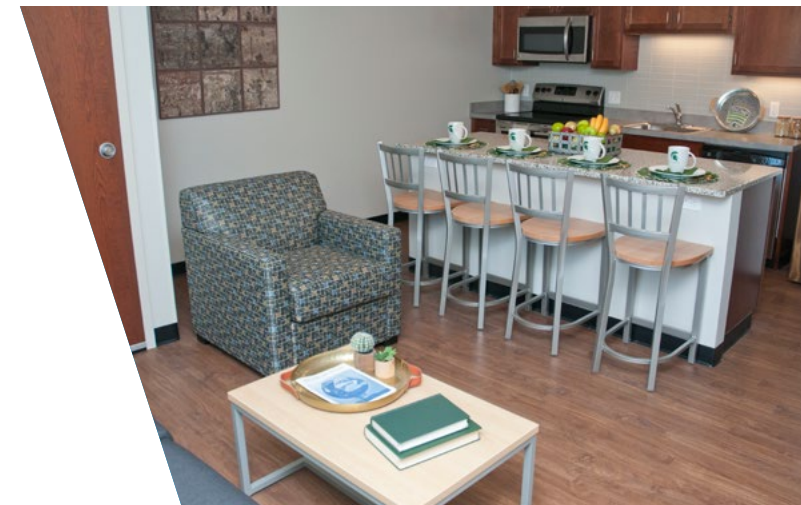

You've got options! As a graduate student, you have the choice to purchase either an On-Campus or an Off-Campus Dining Plan. Owen and apartment dining plans are not required, but highly encouraged.

Off-Campus Dining Plans

- Block plans come in sets of 10, 25, 50, 100 or 150 meal accesses.
- Use meal accesses at any residential dining hall on campus.
 - Accesses can also be used to bring guests to eat with you in the dining halls.
- Use meal accesses as a Combo-X-Change at participating locations, including mobile order.
 - Use multiple Combo-X-Changes per day (each Combo deducts one meal access).
- Off-campus plans remain active as long as you have your MSU ID card and keep the plan active by using at least one meal in a one-year academic cycle.

On-Campus Dining Plans

Unlimited access to the dining halls throughout the academic year.

DineOn Platinum

- 12 Combo-X-Change (CX) redemptions per week, Sunday through Saturday
- \$300 Spartan Cash (each semester, does not expire)
- Eight guest meal passes per semester (guest passes expire at the end of the semester)
- Full terms and conditions: spartancash.msu.edu/terms

DineOn Gold

- 12 Combo-X-Change (CX) redemptions per week, Sunday through Saturday
- \$150 Spartan Cash (each semester, does not expire)
- Four guest meal passes per semester
 - Guest passes expire at the end of the semester(full terms and conditions: spartancash.msu.edu/terms)

DineOn Silver

- 12 Combo-X-Change (CX) redemptions per week, Sunday through Saturday
- Spartan Cash not included but can be added at spartancash.msu.edu
- Guest meal passes not included (guests can pay the public rate at the door)

Residence Hall Access

- Doors and elevators to living wings locked 24/7
- Exterior entrances access only at designated hours
- ID required for residents to access these spaces
