Youth Outcomes

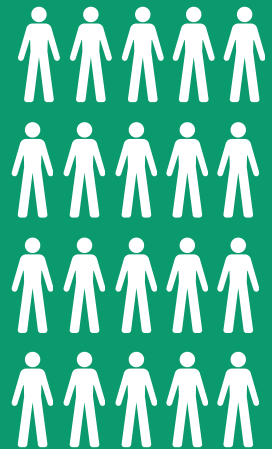
Youth in ADP work with their mentors to accomplish their goals, meet the requirements of probation (formal) or avoid probation entirely (informal), and develop positive traits like:
