

Site and Use Regulations of NürnbergMesse GmbH

As of July 2024

These site regulations apply to the entire grounds of Nürnberg Messe GmbH (referred to hereinafter as "NürnbergMesse"), including all buildings and open areas (referred to hereinafter as the "exhibition grounds").

NürnbergMesse exercises the domiciliary rights along with the respective event organiser. The agreements made additionally with exhibitors, service partners and NürnbergMesse remain unaffected.

1. Domiciliary rights

- 1.1 NürnbergMesse exercises the sole domiciliary rights to the rented object and site unless the tenant is entitled to these rights by act of law. The justified rights of the tenant shall be taken into account when exercising domiciliary rights.
- 1.2 The domiciliary rights with respect to the tenant and all third parties shall be exercised by personnel appointed by NürnbergMesse, whose instructions must be followed without exception and who are to be granted access to the rental object at all times. The instructions of the security staff must be followed.
- 1.3 NürnbergMesse is authorised to expel anyone from the exhibition grounds who violates the site regulations or exhibits disturbing behaviour, withdraw their admission tickets without compensation, and have their vehicles towed away at the owner's cost and risk.
- 1.4 NürnbergMesse has the right to inspect the storage compartments of vehicles and receptacles carried by persons, if required.
- 1.5 In case of theft of exhibits, the relevant person will be expelled from the site. The police will be informed. However, NürnbergMesse reserves the right to exercise its right to detain the relevant person on the exhibition grounds until the person's identity is established by the police.
- 1.6 The exhibition grounds may be entered on foot or in a vehicle only by persons with valid access credentials (employee IDs, service partner IDs, event-specific admission tickets, assembly and disassembly IDs, Tickets of the ServiceTicketingPortal (STP) or logistics system (transITfair) at the established times. Children under 16 years of age may enter the exhibition grounds only in the company of supervising adults unless another arrangement is made for a specific event. Visitors to the event must leave the exhibition grounds at the end of the daily event hours.
- 1.7 The instructions of the event director appointed by NürnbergMesse, the event equipment director and the security manager must be followed without exception. The instructions of public security services such as police, customs, fire brigade, and office of public order must likewise be followed without exception.

2. Building facilities, technical infrastructure

Technical facilities may only be operated by NürnbergMesse or by authorised Service Partners. This applies also, for example, to connections to on-site electrical installations and electrical outlets, data networks, communications network, water and sewerage installations, and compressed air network.

3. Changes to the building structure/floors

The tenant is financially responsible for all changes, installations and decorations made by the tenant. The tenant is also responsible for the costs for restoration of the original condition.

Hall components and technical facilities may not be damaged, soiled, or otherwise changed (e.g. drilling, nailing, screwing, glueing). Painting, wallpapering, and gluing are also not permitted.

Floor coverings in the exhibition stands may only be fixed with adhesive tape, which must be removed without residue after use.

As a general rule, all materials used must be removed without residue after use. Substances such as oil, grease, paint and similar must be removed from the floor immediately. The hall floor may not be painted or glued. Anchors and fastenings in the hall floor are not permitted.

Materials made available by the lessor must be returned in good order and condition. The tenant shall be obligated to pay compensation for damage to walls, floors and rented materials. Easily flammable materials which cause flaming droplets when burning or which generate toxic gas.

4. Fire protection and safety provisions

- 4.1 All materials brought into the halls, including exhibits, must be included in a risk assessment. As a general rule, easily flammable materials which cause flaming droplets when burning or which generate toxic gases or heavy smoke may not be used in the construction of exhibition stands. This prohibition also applies to thermoplastic materials such as polystyrene hard foam (PU foam, polystyrene, styrodur, EPS, XPS, etc.) and PVC. Please refer to the latest version of the Technical Guidelines (Info 4, para. 4.4) for other fire protection and safety provisions.
- 4.2 Exhibition stands, including furnishings and exhibits, installations, structures and advertising media must be constructed in a stable manner to ensure that public safety and order, particularly lives and health, are not endangered. The causer is responsible and where applicable must provide proof for the stability of all structures and exhibits. This applies also during assembly and disassembly. Please refer to the latest version of the Technical Guidelines (Info 4) for additional requirements to be met with respect to stability, necessary load capacities and required load assumptions both indoors and outdoors.
- 4.3 Trade inspection and regulatory authorities, police and fire brigade, fire protection officers, the event director, the security manager or the event equipment director of NürnbergMesse are authorised to issue instructions within the scope of the safety provisions. These instructions are binding and must be followed.

Explicit reference is made to the necessity of compliance with public laws, regulations, decrees, directives, information, rules and information and the **Technical Guidelines (Info 4)** of NürnbergMesse in the currently valid version.

This includes but is not limited to the following documents: Bavarian Building Code, Bavarian Regulations on Places of Assembly, Bavarian Directive on the Building and Operation of Mobile Constructions, Industrial Code, Explosives Act, Air Traffic Act, Federal Emissions Control Act, Product Safety Act, Technical Rules of the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation for Artificial Optical Radiation (TROS Laser), Radiation Protection Act, Telecommunications Act, Food Hygiene Regulation, Youth Protection Act and Social Security Code Volume Seven in conjunction with the publications of the accident insurance carrier.

5. Animals

As a general rule, animals may not be brought into the halls and rooms during events. An exception to this rule is made for animals that make up the exhibit or that are absolutely necessary for the presentation of the exhibit. An exception to this rule is also made for animals if they are part of a show or demonstration. Every animal presentation, including the species and number of animals, must be reported to the organiser in writing. Animals may not be allowed to pose a threat to third parties. The owner is responsible for species-appropriate accommodation and presentation and for the harmless removal of the animal or animals in case of an emergency evacuation. The instructions of the regulatory authorities must be followed. If stables are provided on the grounds, NürnbergMesse will not become the animal keeper. This responsibility along with all subordinate responsibilities lies with the organiser (tenant) or directly with the animal owner. At no time may animals be brought into the office premises; in particular, dogs are prohibited. Seeing-eye dogs are exempted from this prohibition.

6. Smoking ban/Consumption of drugs

Smoking is generally banned on the entire exhibition grounds. Smoking is only permitted in specially designated areas. The consumption of cannabis and the consumption of drugs, i.e. substances that violate the German Narcotic Drugs Act (Betäubungsmittelgesetz - BtMG), is prohibited on the entire exhibition grounds without exception.

7. Lost property/personal injuries and property damage

Objects found on the grounds must be presented to the information and service counters or in the **SecurityControlUnit (SCU)**. Any personal injury or damage to property must be reported immediately to the SecurityControlUnit (SCU).

8. Traffic regulations on the exhibition grounds

The road traffic regulations are applicable as appropriate everywhere on the exhibition grounds and in the exhibition's own parking areas. The maximum permitted speed on the exhibition grounds 20 km/h. It is not permitted to drive vehicles into the halls during assembly and disassembly. It is not permitted to operate very small electrical vehicles (e.g. e-rollers, e-scooters, segways, etc.) in the halls. When used on the grounds of NürnbergMesse, such vehicles must meet the requirements for use on public roads.

9. Liability

NürnbergMesse shall be liable only in cases of intent or gross negligence except in cases of violation of material contractual obligations and damage to life, body or health. The same applies for the liability of our vicarious agents.

10. Advertising

Advertising of any kind, the offering of goods and services of any kind, the acceptance of orders and the conducting of exhibition surveys outside of exhibition stands are not permitted without the express written consent of NürnbergMesse.

11. Photographing/filming

A general photography and filming ban applies throughout the exhibition grounds. Photographing, filming and drawing of exhibited goods or exhibition stands on the grounds and in the halls is permitted only in justified exceptional cases.

In case of violations, NürnbergMesse shall be entitled to confiscate data carriers, drawings and/or film material without compensation. Alternatively, the erasure of data carriers may be demanded.

12. Sale of guest tickets

Visitors and exhibitors are prohibited from selling guest tickets.

13. Weapons, explosive substances, munitions

Weapons and objects similar to weapons may not be brought into the Exhibition Centre Nuremberg unless they are exhibits.

When weapons are exhibited, weapons laws and regulations must be observed without exception. Permission to exhibit any weapons and other objects that are explicitly prohibited under the Weapons Act (WaffG) must be obtained from the Federal Criminal Police Office! The exhibition of weapons classified as weapons of war in Germany under the War Weapons Control Act (KrWaffKontrG) is only possible with a permit from the Federal Ministry of Economics and Climate Protection.

Explosive substances are subject to the Explosive Act, as amended, and may not be exhibited or used at trade fairs and exhibitions. The same applies for munitions, charges and bullets according to the definition of the Weapons Act, as well as pyrotechnic objects.

14. Video surveillance

Reference is made to the fact that the exhibition grounds are under video surveillance for security reasons.

15. Issuance of exclusion orders

NürnbergMesse reserves the right to expel persons who violate the site regulations by issuing exclusion orders for the building and grounds and to have their vehicles towed away at the cost and risk of the vehicle driver or owner.
