Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Is there a fee to enroll in the QI Project Training Program?

There are no fees associated with participating in the QI Project Training Program for Partnership network providers and/or organizations serving our members.

Can I still register for the Quality Improvement (QI) Project Training Program if I have not attended an ABCs of Quality Improvement training?

You're welcome to register for the training program. However, please keep in mind that some of the content in each session builds upon the foundational knowledge provided by the ABCs of Quality Improvement curriculum. Having this foundation will help you engage more fully with the material and support your success throughout the program.

Can I still register for the QI Project Training Program if I do not have a QI initiative and/or a specific measurable goal for the initiative?

Yes. While outlining a QI initiative and a specific measurable goal is strongly encouraged, since it allows you to directly apply concepts from each session, we understand that the timing of our training cohorts may not always align with your current projects.

Participants can still benefit from the program by applying the concepts, tools, and frameworks to projects at various stages, or by preparing for future initiatives. Many of the skills covered are transferable and can be used across multiple projects and program efforts.

Is there anything else I will need to be prepared for the courses?

We ask that candidates who are currently leading / supporting QI projects attend all six webinars, be prepared to participate in discussions and activities throughout the series, provide feedback for program improvement, and have access to a computer with a webcam and microphone.

Will the QI Project Training Program webinar sessions be recorded?

The QI Project Training Program sessions will not be recorded. To get the most out of the program, we encourage you to attend each live session. If you are unable to join, we'll provide condensed session materials and resources to help you stay on track. In addition, the training facilitators will hold peer learning hours between sessions, offering an opportunity to share ideas, ask questions, clarify next steps, and walk through any tools or templates.

What if I miss one or more sessions of the program?

Attendance at all live sessions is strongly recommended, as each one builds on the last and includes interactive components that enhance learning.

If you miss a session, don't worry. While sessions are not recorded, we will share a condensed version of the materials and resources so you can review key concepts and stay on track.

You are also welcome to make up missed sessions by joining a future cohort offering the same session. Additionally, participants may register for and attend the training program as often as they like, whether to revisit content, strengthen skills, or apply learning to new projects.

How much time should I reserve to complete the hands-on project work between training webinars?

The time required will vary depending on the complexity of the project and each homework assignment. However, on average, you should plan to dedicate approximately one to three hours per assignment to complete the hands-on project work between training webinars. There is a total of five assignments throughout the entire series.

Will support be available outside of the live webinar sessions, and if so, where can I register?

Yes. In addition to the live sessions, we offer a 50-minute **Peer Learning Lab** for participants who want extra guidance or a space to collaborate with others.

The Peer Learning Lab functions as an interactive roundtable where you can exchange ideas, compare approaches, and learn from peers working on similar or different projects. Facilitators will also be available to help you clarify next steps, walk through tools and templates, and troubleshoot any challenges -- so you can maintain momentum and move your work forward with confidence.

The Peer Learning Lab is hosted by session facilitators, and joining information will be shared with all registered training participants.
