Breast Cancer Screening (BCS)	Members ages 40 – 74 and assigned female at birth. DOB between January 1, 1952, and December 31, 1984.	At least one mammogram on or between October 1, 2024, and December 31, 2026.	Diagnostic (if coded bilateral) or screening mammograms accepted. Document mastectomy (hx) for exclusion from the measure.										
Cervical Cancer Screening (CCS)	Members ages 21 – 64 and assigned female at birth. DOB between January 1, 1962, and December 31, 2002.	Appropriate screening for cervical cancer. Types of screenings accepted: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pap (Cytology) every 3 years, OR • Primary HPV every 5 years, OR • Co-test (Pap+HPV) every 5 years 	Self-collection is acceptable. Document clearly whether the test was Pap, HPV, or co-test. Document absence of cervix for exclusion.										
Child and Adolescent Well Care Visits (WCV)	Members ages 3 – 17 as of December 31, 2026. DOB between January 1, 2009, and December 31, 2023.	At least one well-care visit with a PCP or OB/GYN during the measurement year. Must include history, physical exam, anticipatory guidance, and developmental / behavioral screening.	Components of the WCV can be spread across multiple visits, as long as they all occur and are documented in the measurement year.										
Childhood Immunization Status (CIS 10)	Members turning two years old between January 1 and December 31, 2026. Chlamydia Screening (CHL)	Members ages 16 – 24 and assigned female at birth. DOB between January 1, 2002, and December 31, 2010.	At least one test for chlamydia during the measurement year.	Universal screening of all members ages 16 – 24 is recommended, regardless of reported sexual activity.										

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Colorectal Cancer Screening (COL)	Members ages 45 – 75. DOB between January 1, 1951, and December 31, 1980.	One or more screenings for colorectal cancer. Types of screenings accepted: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • FOBT / FIT: during the calendar year • FIT-DNA (Cologuard): 3 years • Flexible Sigmoidoscopy: 5 years • CT Colonography: 5 years • Colonoscopy: 10 years 	Document Colorectal Cancer and Total Colectomy (hx) for exclusion from the measure. Educate patients about Cologuard so they are prepared to receive the box in the mail and understand the process.
Comprehensive Diabetes Care: HbA1c Good Control (HbA1c)	Members ages 18 – 75 with diabetes identified as of December 31, 2026. DOB between January 1, 1951, and December 31, 2008.	Most recent HbA1c measurement at or below 9.0% during the measurement year.	If multiple readings are taken during the measurement year, the most recent value should be at or below 9.0% to be compliant.
Comprehensive Diabetes Care: Retinal Eye Exams (REE)	Members ages 18 – 75 with diabetes identified as of December 31, 2026. DOB between January 1, 1951, and December 31, 2008.	At least one diabetic retinopathy screening or diabetic eye exam completed during the measurement year OR documentation of a negative retinal or dilated eye exam completed during the measurement year or the year prior.	Must be completed each year. Does not have to be a full year between exams. Incorporates asking where the patient gets their eye exam at every DM visit to obtain external records.

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Controlling High Blood Pressure (CBP)	Members ages 18 – 85 with at least two visits or virtual check-ins on different dates of service, with a hypertension diagnosis on or between January 1, 2025, and June 30, 2026. DOB between January 1, 1941, and December 31, 2008.	Most recent BP reading* taken during the measurement year at an outpatient visit, a nonacute inpatient encounter, or remote monitoring. The reading must be less than 140/90 mm Hg. *BP reading must occur on or after the date of the second diagnosis of hypertension.	Only the most recent BP of the year counts. Use the lowest systolic and diastolic if multiple readers were taken on the same day. Both numbers must be included on the same claim. Home / Remote BP is acceptable if digitally transmitted or documented by clinical staff.
Kidney Health Evaluation for Patients with Diabetes (KED)	Members ages 18 – 85 with Type 1 or Type 2 diabetes diagnosis. DOB between January 1, 1941, and December 31, 2008.	Received both an estimated glomerular filtration rate (eGFR) and a urine albumin-creatinine ratio (uACR) during the measurement year on the same or different dates of service.	If ordering “microalbumin” ensure the lab runs albumin-creatinine ratio (uACR), not albumin alone. BMP / CMP covers eGFR. Both a quantitative urine albumin test and a urine creatinine test must have service dates that are four days or less apart.
Lead Screening in Children (LSC)	Members turning two years old between January 1 and December 31, 2026. DOB between January 1, 2024, and December 31, 2024.	At least one lead capillary or venous blood test on or before the second birthday.	Testing is required at 12 and 24 months. Do catch-up testing for members 24 – 72 months who missed it. In-office POC or sample collection is preferred over external lab orders.

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Immunizations for Adolescents (IMA 2)	Members turning 13 years old between January 1 and December 31, 2026. DOB between January 1, 2013, and December 31, 2013.	1 dose meningococcal vaccine 1 dose Tdap HPV vaccination series ALL doses must be completed by the 13th birthday.	Start HPV shots at age nine to avoid timing issues; a six-month interval is required between the first and second doses. Educate parents and teens about the HPV vaccine and its effectiveness for preventing multiple cancers.
Well-Child Visits in the First 15-Months of Life (W15 or W30+6)	Members turning 15-months between January 1 and December 31, 2026. DOB between October 3, 2024, and October 2, 2025.	At least six well-child visits with a PCP by the age of 15-months.	Visits must be at least 14 days apart. Schedule the next WCV before the patient leaves the clinic to prevent care gaps.

Well-Child Visits in the First 15- to 30-Months of Life (W30 or W30+2)	Members turning 30-months between January 1 and December 31, 2026. DOB between July 5, 2023, and July 4, 2024.	At least two well-child visits on different dates of service between the age of 15-months plus one day and the age of 30-months.	Visits must be at least 14 days apart. Schedule the next WCV before the family leaves the clinic to prevent care gaps.
Topical Fluoride in Children (TFL)	Members ages 1 – 4 as of December 31, 2026. DOB between January 1, 2022, and December 31, 2025.	Two or more fluoride varnish applications during the measurement year, on different dates of service.	Apply every three to six months, especially for high-risk children. Up to four applications are allowed per year.
