## AICE: Operational Readiness for PIC Start-up

The Asset Integrity Confidence Enhancement (AICE) is a collaboration between PRefChem and PETRONAS with the core objective of enhancing the operational readiness of the plant start-up in Pengerang Integrated Complex (PIC). Undertaken by an Integrated Assurance Team jointly led by PRefChem Technical Discipline Support GM En. Zuraimi Idris and PRPC Asset Integrity and Start-up Readiness SGM Datuk Nur Iskandar, the team is divided into three major workstreams; Asset Integrity, Operation & Process and Start-up & Debugging.

The Asset Integrity (AI) workstream focuses on analysing critical equipment by utilising Oil and Gas screening best practices. Through this, project packages that have equipment failure history will be scrutinised and preventive measures will be carried out. Inspections and testings will also be conducted based on multiple disciplines including electrical and mechanical.

Under the Operation & Process workstream, the team will review and verify the effectiveness of the preservation exercise. The previous operation practices which include the Safe Operating Limits (SOL), Management of Change (MOC) are carefully reviewed whereby lessons learnt from the industry are incorporated.

In the Start-up & Debugging workstream, the team is responsible to introduce a debugging regime during the initial start-up phase and to undertake inspections and rectification works on any abnormality found during the observation period. The Operation Manual or Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) will be enhanced based on the debugging findings.

AICE reports to the AICE Steering Committee chaired by En. Hanafi Dewa, CEO of PRefChem and co-chaired by En. Kamal Bahrin B Ahmad, SVP and CEO of PRPC. In the spirit of 'One Team One Goal' and 'Winning Together', the team will continue to work tirelessly with the support from across PIC towards achieving its completion and mission success.
