PIC ships first LPG post Start-up





After two years, Pengerang Integrated Complex has shipped its first Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) after the Start-up in May this year. This is another milestone achieved as the last LPG shipment out from PIC was in February 2020.

Two shipments lifted around 2500MT of Pressurized LPG Mix each to Philippines and Bangladesh. In future, we can expect to ship to other destinations such as the South East Asia and South Asia markets based on the number of tenders received and won.

Our main Pressurized LPG importers are from Philippines, Vietnam and Bangladesh due to geographical advantage. We may ship to Bangladesh once Philippines and Vietnam are fully covered and the fourth market option could be South China.
