

'Speak Up' are not mere words on a poster: Tengku Taufik



The prompt cross collaboration between OPU, PRPC and PRefChem, coupled with the bravery of teams on the ground was commendable, says PETRONAS President & Group Executive Officer Datuk Tengku Taufik in his recent visit to the PETRONAS Integrated Complex (PIC) On 29 Oct 2022 with the PIC Management, Emergency Response Teams as well as OSB 402 and OSB 405 front-liners.

Tengku Taufik praised each member of the teams involved for their **courage, determination, strength, and outstanding dedication in containing the incident**. "From what I discovered in person; their selfless acts were a true demonstration of banding together as a team. Each member took the necessary actions and made tough decisions in a life-threatening crisis. The actions and decisions proved to be right as they managed to get out of harm's way," he wrote in his posting in the PETRONAS Dot.

On Oct 27, a major fire occurred but it was contained and extinguished in just over an hour with no casualty reported. Teams have been formed to undertake coordinated tasks including investigations, which will report to agencies and regulators, as well as send communications to notify key stakeholders and the surrounding community. The Utilities & Facilities Recovery Steering Committee (URSC) have also been mobilised to focus on post-incident recovery plans.

He also emphasised on the importance of **Speaking Up**. "The leadership team with me in Pengerang deliberately made it a point to sit down with our brave colleagues not to question, or to scrutinise their actions - but simply to listen as they spoke up to share their experience, their fears and ultimately their bravery in the face of danger. Everyone must practice Speaking Up, regardless of rank or title to demonstrate we care about each other: as colleagues, as friends, and ultimately as a family," he added.

Stating that there is **no excuse when it comes to safety**, Tengku Taufik said there is a lot that can be learnt from the incident and continue to focus on **process safety as well as a generative HSE culture**. "This is arguably our most important shared responsibility. As we pause to reflect and learn from this incident, please join me in taking a moment to say a prayer for the quick recovery of our colleagues who were affected by the fire. And as part of that prayer, let us all humbly ask the Almighty to grant us greater strength and unwavering perseverance in the face of adversity," he added.

The visit was also attended by Datuk Sazali Hamzah, En Kamal Bahrin Ahmad, Mr Joost Emmen, and En Noor Ilias Mohd Idris. The leaders visited the actual incident area at PRPC UF Interconnecting Pipeline and detailed description on the location of the incident and affected area were explained. The team also discussed on recovery and way forward plan post the incident.

PRefChem holds first Process Safety Workshop

The PRefChem Process Safety Management (PSM) conducted its first-ever session of the Process Safety Leadership Workshop (PSLW) which was attended by the Management Team and Technical Professionals from various disciplines with a total number of 43 participants. PSLW is one of the strategic initiatives identified by the PSM team to instill and establish a common understanding on the **needs of Process Safety in preventing any prevalent Process Safety incidents from occurring in PRefChem**.

Themed **"I Am Process Safety Barrier"**, the workshop's objective is to support PRefChem's HSE strategy to reinforce Leadership role modeling at all levels in amplifying Generative Culture and Driving Sustainable HSE Performance. It is also aligned with PRefChem HSE Excellence key strategies to inculcate a safety compliance culture and provide a safe and respectful working environment.

The PSLW started with welcoming remarks by Hj. Ridzuan Jalaluddin, the Head of HSE, followed by a keynote message by Mr. Joost Emmen, CEO of PRefChem in which he emphasised that the prevention of Process Safety Incidents is a moral obligation that needs to start with **Leadership Behavior from ourselves first then only it could become an effective Process Safety Barrier**.

The event then continued with the Business Case for Change by Mr. Yasser A Al Habidi, the Head of OSCM followed by "I Am Process Safety Barrier" by Mr. Balvinder Singh AL Bachitara Singh, Head of PSM, DBE prior to breakout session entitled "Understanding Barrier Management & Analysis through Case Studies".
