Finally, the time is here. We are now approaching a critical milestone for the PRPC Group of Companies OE R2 Initial Implementation Assessment (IIA). The OE R2, which commenced in Oct 2021, was kicked-off with aligning our work process in mind and for the organisation to work towards a Self-Directed and Empowered Organisation.



The IIA will be carried out between 22 May to 30 May 2023 involving Operate Facility Work Process (OFWP) and Maintenance Facility Work Process (MFWP). Once successfully completed, PRPC will enter "Ready to Proceed" phase. In Shaa Allah.

Throughout our OE R2 journey, PRPC has held a series of engagement with other OPUs (PCG, PDB, PGB & MRCSB), KAPENAS as well as maintaining good collaboration with Technology Center, DBE. Although it was not all beds of roses, about 30 trainings managed to be conducted for approximately 600 staff as it is one of the requirements before we achieve the IIA for OE R2.

The aim is to be able to achieve successful IIA for Operate Facilities Work Process (OFWP) & Maintain Facilities Work Process (MFWP) supported by Empowerment, Management System, Organization Design,



Leadership & Culture, Capability, Governance & Risk and Digital work streams covering all asset under PRPC GoC. In achieving this objective, strategic alignment and collaboration established with PC INA as PRPC GOC and PC INA need to be on board together due to integration of PC INA Execute Maintenance (EM) team in PRPC UF MFWP team.

OE R2 will enable us to rewire our organisational structure and talent allocation by allowing us to do more with the same amount of talent and resources. When implemented successfully, it will enable a standardised way of doing work across functions, define requirements and retain knowledge, redistribute decision making hence improving the speed of making decisions closest to where the actions are.
