

# Rules and regulations for no-truck zones in the inner west



## Fact Sheet



Large trucks like these have an alternative route via new roads, tunnel and ramps.

Large trucks, including container trucks, are no longer allowed on key residential streets in the inner west.

This fact sheet explains the exemptions to the no-truck zones that are now in place.

Truck drivers and businesses should become familiar with the new routes and ways to travel, as well as understand how to make the most of the travel benefits.



### No-truck zones in the inner west

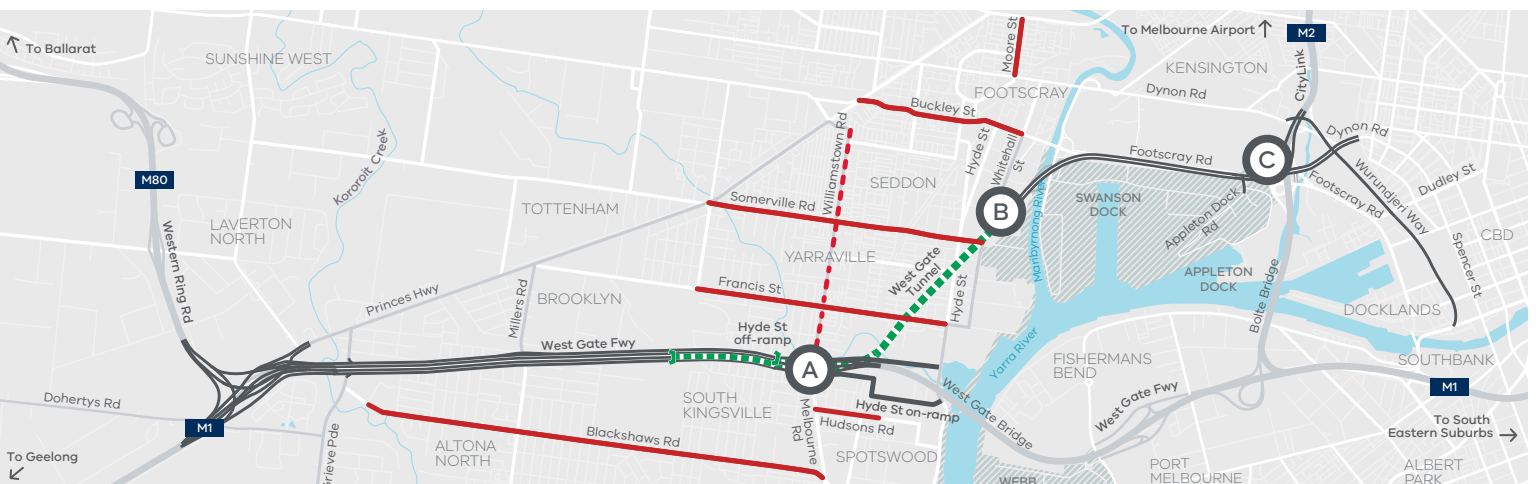
24/7 no-truck zones are in place on:

- Francis Street in Yarraville
- Somerville Road in Yarraville
- Buckley Street in Footscray
- Moore Street in Footscray

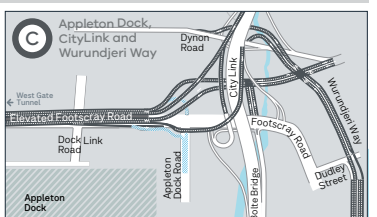
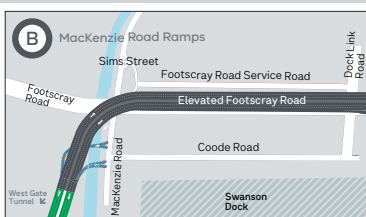
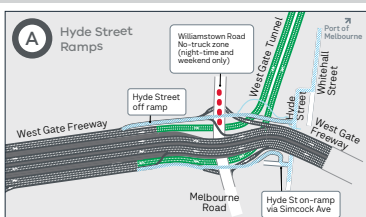
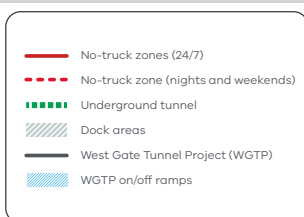
- Blackshaws Road in Altona North
- Hudsons Road in Spotswood

A night-time and weekend no-truck zone is also in place on Williamstown Road (8pm to 6am weekdays and at all times on weekends).

## How no-truck zones are being enforced

Roadside cameras are monitoring trucks along the no-truck zones, collecting information to help the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator (NHVR) enforce the rules.

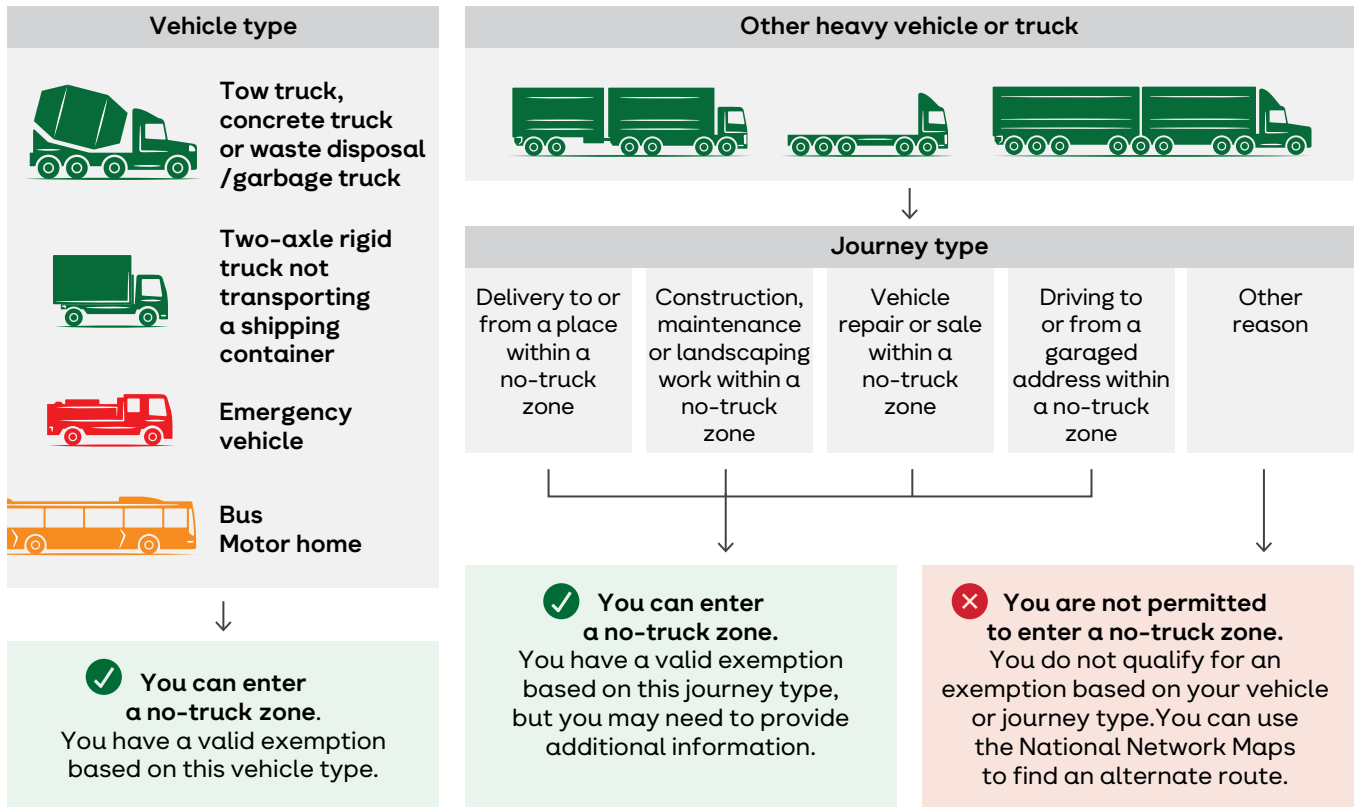
Enforcement activities are in place.

Drivers or businesses that continue to use no-truck zones without an exemption will be fined.

NHVR will hold the vehicle's registered owner responsible for fines if their truck is caught in a no-truck zone without a valid exemption. Where required, there will be additional opportunities to have this reviewed.

## How to find out if you can travel in a no-truck zone

For general access heavy vehicles



For restricted access Class 1, 2 & 3 heavy vehicles, including Special Purpose Vehicles: Refer to the National Network Maps (NNM) on the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator's (NHVR) website to check the available network and approval status for your vehicle type. If your vehicle or journey type is lawfully permitted within a no-truck zone this will be identified by the NHVR and no further action will be taken.

For journey exemptions there will be an online process available on the DTP website to notify NHVR of your travel and provide proof of exemption. Where required, there will also be additional opportunities to have this reviewed.
