

Crossing at intersections without traffic lights

At intersections without traffic lights, drivers are required to give way to pedestrians crossing the road the driver is turning into. Here are some tips for pedestrians when crossing at intersections:

- Check that drivers have seen you make eye contact – and be sure that they will give way.
- Keep looking for turning vehicles.
- Stop and give way to vehicles going straight ahead or turning out of the road you are crossing. Drivers are not required to give way to pedestrians crossing in front of them. Even though they may be facing a 'Give Way' or 'Stop' sign, you must still stop and allow the car to pass.
- Plan walking routes to include safe crossing points, and avoid crossing at busy intersections without traffic lights.
- Use marked pedestrian crossings where possible.









Drivers and riders at intersections without traffic lights:

- Need to look out for pedestrians.
- Must give way to pedestrians crossing the road they are turning into.
- Have a duty of care, as do all road users, to act safely to avoid a collision.

Don't expect others to give way, even if they should.
