



Using pedestrian crossing without traffic lights

At intersections without traffic lights, drivers are required to give way to pedestrians crossing the road the driver is turning into. Here are some tips for pedestrians when crossing at intersections.

Make sure you have been seen and that the driver will give way to you.

Make eye contact.

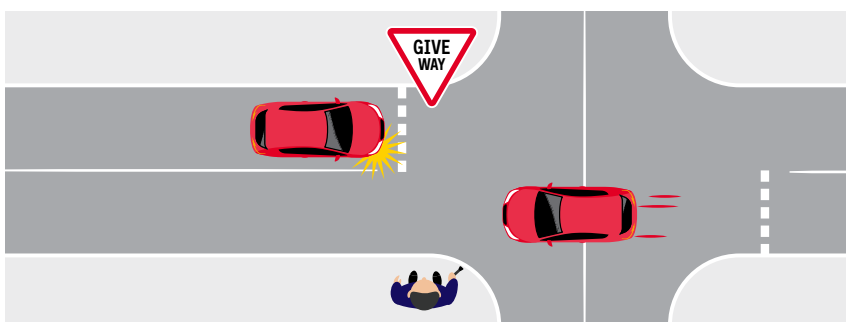


Keep looking
for turning vehicles.

Drivers are not required to give way to pedestrians crossing in front of them. Even though they may be facing a 'Give Way' or 'Stop' sign, you must still stop and allow the car to pass.



Stop and give way
to vehicles going straight ahead or turning out of the road you are crossing.





Don't expect others to give way even if they should

Drivers and riders at intersections without traffic lights:

- Need to look out for pedestrians.
- Must give way to pedestrians crossing the road they are turning into.
- Have a duty of care, as do all road users, to act safely to avoid a collision.

Plan walking routes
to include safe crossing
points and use marked
pedestrian crossings
where possible.
