

# Managing Brain Death in the ICU Programme

## PROGRAMME DESCRIPTION

Certification of brain death is a complex and time consuming multi-step process with many potential pitfalls and confounders. It is also an important responsibility shouldered by clinicians working in intensive care units.

Families and loved ones are often overwhelmed by having to deal with the suddenness of the devastating neurologic injury, understanding the concept of brain death and coming to terms with its consequences, including the withdrawal of therapy or potential organ donation.

This programme has been put together by Tan Tock Seng Hospital (TTSH), and supported by NHG College, to help Intensive Care Unit (ICU) clinicians deal with these complex issues when managing potentially brain-dead patients.
