

INDICATORS TO WATCH FOR IN HOTELS



Has excessive baggage or few or no personal possessions and not suitably dressed for the weather



Pays for room in cash or pre-paid credit card one day at a time



A young person accompanied by someone claiming to be a parent or guardian who is, in fact, not related to the youth



Refuses housekeeping, requests multiple towels, evidence of alcohol or drugs



INDICATORS THAT A PERSON MAY BE AT RISK OF *Sexual Exploitation & Human Trafficking!*



1 ARE FEARFUL, ANXIOUS, DEPRESSED, SUBMISSIVE, NERVOUS, OR PARANOID



2 APPEARS MALNOURISHED, SLEEP-DEPRIVED, OR IN NEED OF MEDICAL CARE



3 SHOWS SIGNS OF OWNERSHIP, SUCH AS TATTOOS, BRANDS, AND JEWELRY PROPERTY



4 HAS MULTIPLE CELL PHONES



5 HAS HOTEL ROOM KEYS



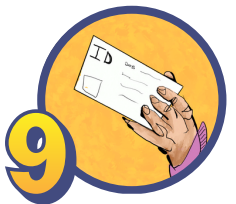
6 LACKS KNOWLEDGE OF A GIVEN COMMUNITY OR WHEREABOUTS



7 DISPLAYS A DRAMATIC PERSONALITY CHANGE, EVASIVE BEHAVIOUR, AND DISENGAGEMENT FROM SCHOOL, HOBBIES, FAMILY, AND FRIENDS



8 HAS EXPENSIVE ITEMS, SUCH AS HAIR STYLES, MANICURES, CELL PHONES, CLOTHES, AND EXCESS CASH, WITH NO KNOWN SOURCE OF INCOME



9 INCONSISTENCIES IN INFORMATION AND LACK OF ID

OUTSIDE HOTELS, YOU CAN:

CALL 911

FOR EMERGENCY SUPPORT

CALL 211

IF YOU OR SOMEONE YOU KNOW NEEDS RESOURCES OR SERVICES IN ALBERTA

If the victim is under 18, it is **mandatory under provincial and federal law** to report any case of suspected or known sexual exploitation.

School staff are to follow school protocol on child abuse to **report suspected human trafficking activity**.



10 PROTECTS THE PERSON WHO IS HURTING THEM AND IS NOT ALLOWED OR ABLE TO SPEAK FOR THEMSELVES



11 IS A CHRONIC TRUANT, RUNAWAY, OR HOMELESS YOUTH
