Dunes Surgical Hospital CHNA Implementation Strategy Fiscal Years 2019-2021

The Dunes Surgical Hospital completed a comprehensive Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) that was adopted by the Board of Directors on 4/16/2019. The Dunes Surgical Hospital performed the CHNA in adherence with applicable federal requirements for not-for-profit hospitals set forth in the Affordable Care Act (ACA) and by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). The assessment took into account a comprehensive review of secondary data analysis of patient outcomes, community health status, and social determinants of health, as well as primary data collection including input from representatives of the community, community members, and various community organizations.

Hospital Information

The Dunes Surgical Hospital is located in Dakota Dunes, SD. The hospital is accredited by the Joint Commission, and specializes in Dental/Oral Surgery, Ear Nose and Throat, General, Gastrointestinal, Gynecology, Neurosurgery, Ophthalmology, Orthopedic, Pain, Plastic, Podiatry, Spine, and Urology. The hospital's focus is on offering a high quality, service-oriented environment for patient's surgical procedures.

Mission

The Dunes Surgical Hospital's mission is to treat each patient and their family as if it were our own. Each patient, each family, each and every time.

Health Needs of the Community

The CHNA conducted throughout 2018 identified the significant health needs within the Dunes Surgical Hospital's community. Those needs were then prioritized based on the

results of an activity where community representatives ranked the community needs. The significant health needs identified, in order of priority include:

1) Housing/Homelessness	To decrease homelessness and improve housing environments within Siouxland
2) Mental Health	To improve the mental health landscape in the Siouxland area
3) Sexual Health	 To provide accurate sexual health education, services and preventions services in the Siouxland area
4) Substance Abuse/Tobacco	 To decrease use of substance abuse in the Siouxland area
5) Obesity/Chronic Health Condition	To ensure obesity rates do not continue to climb in the Siouxland area
6) Access to Care	 To improve access to care within Siouxland

Hospital Implementation Strategy

The Dunes Surgical Center's resources and overall alignment with the hospital's mission, goals and strategic priorities were taken into consideration of the significant health needs identified through the most recent CHNA process.

Significant health needs to be addressed

The Dunes Surgical Hospital will focus on developing and/or supporting initiatives and measure their effectiveness, to improve the following health needs:

- Housing/Homelessness pages 4-5
- Substance Abuse/Tobacco pages 6-7
- Obesity/Chronic Health Condition pages 7-8
- o Access to Care pages 8-9

Significant health needs that will not be addressed

The Dunes Surgical Hospital acknowledges the wide range of priority health issues that emerged from the CHNA process, and determined that it could effectively focus on only those health needs which it deemed most pressing, under-addressed, and within its ability to influence. The Dunes Surgical Hospital will not take action on the following health needs:

Brief description of need:

The number of residents in the communities served that reside in a housing unit that has at least one substandard condition is 23%. During a point in time count in 2018, 292 individuals were identified as homeless. During the 2017-2018 school year, the Sioux City Community Schools identified 388 students as homeless.

Goal: Decrease homelessness and improve housing environments within Siouxland.

SMART Objective(s):

Decrease the number of homeless individuals in Sioux City from 298 to 250 by 2021. Assist with community efforts in opening one 24/7 facility by 2021 that expands access to programs/services to reduce homelessness.

Plan to evaluate the impact:

An annual point-in-time count is completed annually to determine prevalence of homelessness. Progress will be measured in establishing a shelter that is available 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. Occupancy of the sheltered will be measured.

Brief description of need:

Substance Abuse and Tobacco

Goal: Decrease use of substance abuse in the Siouxland Area.

SMART Objective(s):

- -Open one 24/7 facility that expands access to programs and services to reduce public intoxication arrests in Sioux City from 925 to 850 by 2021.
- -Increase collaborative mechanisms between local chemical dependency service providers to increase services and communication to eliminate gaps and barriers each agency may face by a minimum of 3 by 2021.

Brief description of need:

Obesity/Chronic Disease

Goal: Reduce obesity rates in the Siouxland area.

SMART Objective(s):

- Increase awareness and expand access to programs and services to help reduce obesity from 35% to 33% in Woodbury County by 2021.
- Increase education and support of community members in maintaining a healthy lifestyle and the proper management of chronic health conditions by decreasing the percentage of individuals with diabetes from 9% to 8% in Woodbury County by 2021.

- Enable our community to access all levels of healthcare in a timely and efficient fashion by offering a minimum of 7 new avenues to access care by 2021.
