"I knew this day would probably come," shares Ray Aughinbaugh of Fairfield, PA. Three of his brothers died of massive heart attacks. In September of 2018, Ray woke up with chest pain. He took a pain reliever, but the pain persisted. On his way to work at Gettysburg College he started sweating profusely and knew he needed to go directly to WellSpan Gettysburg Hospital's Emergency Department.

Within minutes of arriving, Ray was in the Catheterization Lab receiving a stent to immediately open a 100 percent blockage of his left anterior descending artery.

Ray had a heart attack known as "the widow maker." This heart event is so severe that Richard Howard, MD, the interventional cardiologist who performed the stent therapy, told Ray he would have died if he hadn't sought care so close to home.

Ray was Dr. Howard's third patient that day, underscoring the need for and importance of having advanced, interventional heart care for patients in our community.

Services available at the Catheterization Lab include interventional treatments for patients with blockages in their arteries, including angioplasty and stent therapy.

Other cardiac procedures include electrophysiology services to treat heart rhythm irregularities, diagnostic catheterization to view blockages around the heart, stress testing to diagnose heart disease and electrocardiograms (EKGs) to understand the heart's electrical signals.

In addition, our local heart care services also include cardiac rehabilitation and congestive heart failure support. These programs are aimed at helping patients who have experienced a heart-related event with maintaining health and reducing future cardiac risk.

To continue to meet the cardiovascular needs of our community, WellSpan Gettysburg Hospital is committed to expanding Catheterization Lab capacity and staying abreast of the latest cardiovascular advancements.

WellSpan Gettysburg Hospital's new Catheterization Lab opened its doors on September 4, 2018.

The impact is significant

- After just four months of operation (September 4 December 31, 2018), 129 diagnostic and interventional patients received cardiovascular care in the new Catheterization Lab.
- Of those 129 patients, 66 patients received interventional care

 more than doubling the initial projection of anticipated cases within the first six months.
- More than a dozen patients suffering life-threatening heart attacks, or STEMIs, have directly benefitted from emergency intervention treatment. Providing immediate care for these patients has significantly reduced the number of patients in need of transfer to WellSpan York Hospital and has helped save lives.
