Utilization Review Notice (To be posted at work site and distributed to employees by employers)

### TO ALL EMPLOYEES Workers' Compensation Utilization Review Program

Your employer and insurance company have selected Zurich Service Corporation (ZSC) to review the medical care and treatment you receive in order to ensure quality and appropriate medical care for any work-related injury or illness which may occur. The ZSC utilization review (UR) program includes experienced registered nurses and licenses board certified physicians who will evaluate the medical treatment provided to you by your attending physician and other health care providers.

## If you are hurt on the job please do the following:

- Ask your supervisor or manager to notify the insurance company of your injury and complete a report of injury form.
- Ask your physician to contact ZSC's Managed Care Service Center for treatment plan authorization at 1-800-451-8731 in order to seek approval of health care services prescribed for your condition. (Failure to have your treatment approved could result in the denial of payment of medical services provided to you by your physician).
- In emergency situations, prior authorization of your treatment is **not** required by you or your attending physician. However, ZSC must be notified of your emergency care within one business day of the delivery of such treatment.
